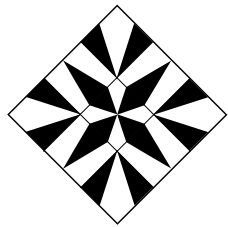

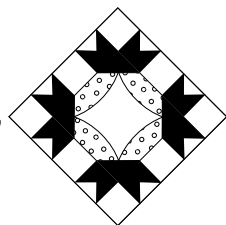

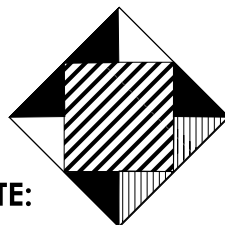

FABULOUS FINDS IS BACK IN MARCH

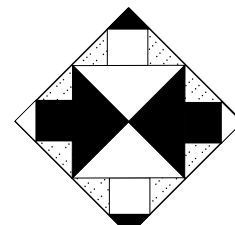

Charity is sponsoring three Charities, Haven, Orchard Children's Services and the Methodist Church Layette program. For those who are new, back in the 50's & 60's if a mother did not have anything for her newborn, they would bring their babies home wrapped up in newspaper. The Methodist Church where we have our meetings started the Layette program. They put together a gift box with baby items in it. The items are for newborns. Birds of a feather flock together. On Mother's Day, they display the gifts boxes for the congregation to see. The church even puts a crib in the sanctuary filled with quilts and many times they are the ones we have made.

March and April we will be accepting items for the Layette program. The following items are what they would like: diapers, wipes, onesies, pajamas, outfit, booties, hats, socks, etc. PLEASE remember they want newborn or 0-3month sizes ONLY. The gift boxes are to be given to a mother who just had a baby. If you are a knitter or like crocheting, baby Afghans are also appreciated. We could use more baby quilts that are 36" X 36" to 40" X 40". When you bring your items in, we will not only be asking you to sign it in, but we also need to know what you spent or the value of your gift. At the end of the year, I have to write a report, so the IRS knows how much we have given in donations to Charitable organizations. You will need to supplement with your own fabric, but you must use the jelly roll you received. Return by May 18, 2023. Finished quilts will be put into drawing for a gift certificate at a quilt shop. A finished quilt top will be in a drawing for a "booby" prize.

RECAP:

- Size: 36"X36" minimum to whatever
- Your fabric: as much as you want
- Finished: in for drawing for Gift Certificate to Quilt Shop
- Quilt top: Drawing for Booby Prize
