Around the country National Quilting Day is traditionally a day for special quilting shows, events, classes and much more to celebrate the day.

Although the third Saturday of March was designated as National Quilting Day, the month of March quickly became National Quilting Month. Quilt shops and retailers will celebrate the month with specials on fabrics, notions and all things sewing. 



Meeting began at 9:15

In attendance: 19 members, Carol H. for her first zoom!

Minutes were read, voted on, Sharon C. will sign and enter them.

Treasurer's Report: There were no expenditures since the last meeting. The fee of \$365 was paid to Dickinson Wright PLLC to register the trademark for 10 years.

Membership - no change. Laurie J. is in the hospital. We send her our best wishes for a fast recovery.

Programs - Jean S. suggested that for March on National Quilting Day we get out a UFO and have a sewing clinic on the next steps to getting it done with advice from our CAMEO sisters.

April - Block history - Double Wedding Ring. If anyone has a DWR quilt, take a picture of it and send it to showandtellcameo@gmail.com. Laurie J. also has some of the DWR pictures already. Valing James doesn't plan to do a virtual workshop about Laura Heine quilts.

BOM - Calendar quilt is ongoing. Make a block for each month.

Facilitator - Jan R. mentioned that the Global Quilt Connection - Meet the Teacher Webinar begins February 22 at 4 p.m.

The Bookclub on February 8 discussed Bonny Hunter of Leader and Ender fame. Her quilts are very scrappy, but make good use of scraps. She has a retreat center in Virginia called Quiltville, where she has groups of up to 12 (post COVID). She also has a blog and writes a lot.

Charity - Carol H. cut 100 pillowcase kits, 50 were passed out last Saturday. 14 members swapped mugrugs at the same time for Valentine's Day.

Nominations And Elections Committee - Henya R. has joined and she, Sandy P. and Jan R. have called members to solicit participation for next year's CAMEO Board. Jan asked if the elections should be moved up if all positions had candidates. President Sharon wants to keep the schedule for June elections. We don't vote earlier than the June meeting as per our bylaws. Henya says it is possible to vote via zoom. The committee will consider changes to procedures to propose to the Board.

Retreat at Columbierre - may not be cancelled.* We will know by Feb. 25. If anyone is interested in attending on April 8-12, they should notify Sharon. Janeen S. reported that if the retreat doesn't happen, we will request our deposit back. If it does happen, details will be provided but at a minimum people will be in their own rooms, there are communal showers, and there would not be a minimum required to attend. **Retreat at Bear Lake** is on for the Fall.

A **Fundraising Committee** is needed says Sharon. Ideas have been proposed, but implementation needs a committee to plan details. Ideas include: masks with the logo, a calendar, a quilter to quilter sale in the fall, a raffle of the COVID quilt. There was a motion by Jackie C. to raffle the COVID quilt and the vote was in favor. Suggestions were to consider an Ebay auction, attending zoom meetings of other guilds to sell tickets, and participation from more members will be needed to help get the quilt shown and tickets sold.

Quilt Show - postponed until 2022.

Hearts and Hugs were sent by Sharon to Barb Eaken and Laurie Johnson who are recuperating. Members will reach out to see if they would like meals or other help.

The Show And Tell included Valentine mugrugs and quilts.

The sewing began and went on until 3:00 with door prizes given by Theresa N. and the Charity Committee.
