SASHIKO!

Lecture: Thursday, Nov. 21 at 7pm

Workshop: Saturday, Nov. 23 • 9am-3pm

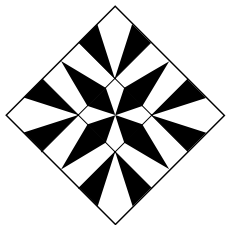
Our November presenter, **Mary DeRay**, will take us on a journey back to hand work with calming and meditative qualities. Japanese Sashiko stitching has a very long history, dating to the 17th century as the simplest of utility mending stitches. Mary's desire to show this form of textile art led her to teach the process. She will bring a trunk show Thursday, November 21 and then we can create our own sashiko squares on Saturday, Nov. 23. This technique is done with linen fabric, sashiko thread or embroidery thread, and sashiko needles. There are various geometric patterns to trace on a center fabric or on borders for bell pulls. The beginner kit costs \$20 and contains a printed linen panel, 2 needles and thread. A second kit contains a printed center panel, 2 colors of thread and 2 needles for \$25. There is also a 3 in 1 pattern for \$10.00. It contains 3 designs for bell-pulls or scrolls (rectangular panels). Patterns and kits will be available for purchase at the Thursday meeting. No sewing machines will be needed for the workshop.

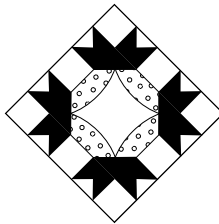
QUILT SHOW DOOR PRIZE COMMITTEE NEEDS YOUR DONATIONS

Pick up your 2019-20 Directory at the Membership table if you did not attend the October meeting.



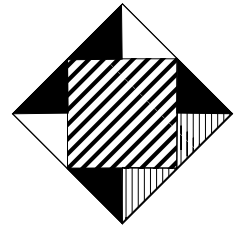

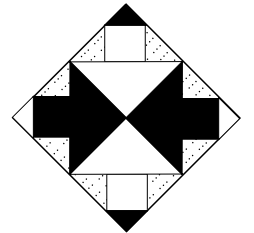


Thank you to the members who contributed to the October Hospitality Table.

A new order for CAMEO T shirts is being sent in, L and XL are \$10, 1X and 2X are \$12. Contact Darlene with a FIRM order.

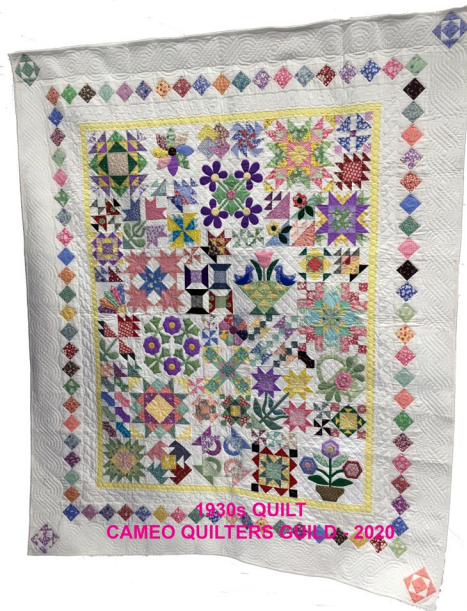
