

**The Quilt Show** - <a href="https://thequiltshow.com/">https://thequiltshow.com/</a> Hosted by Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims. Site is free . Alex will be starting her 4th free sew along in early Nov. She is live Mon., Wed. and Fri. at 1 pm. Ricky may be live on Tues., Thurs., and Sat. If you choose to become a member of the quilt show, than members receive all the past shows featuring teachers and techniques. It's \$19.95 for 6 months

**Amanda Murphy** is live on Face book Thursday at 11am. Search for Amanda Murphy designs in Face book. She talks and demos for 45 min. She primarily teaches machine quilting, with rulers and free motion quilting. Some days, she is on a domestic machine, but she does have a sit down long arm and a stand up long arm. The past couple of weeks she discussed raw edge appliqué with SVG files. She works primarily on Bernina machines, but is familiar with other machines due to her teaching at guilds and shops.

**Missouri Star** - <a href="https://www.missouriquiltco.com/">https://www.missouriquiltco.com/</a> Jenny's tutorials are available for free. Missouri Star has an app and it lists all her free quilt block videos.

Linda Z Quilt Shop - <a href="https://www.lindazs.com/">https://www.lindazs.com/</a> Click on "Events" tab. (from the Chicago area) Featuring virtual classes to make "By Annie" bags-of-the-month. Classes \$89 for 12 monthly claasses which can be watched anytime. Each month a new bag is made. Members purchase the "By Annie" pattern and supplies. Never ask a quilter to dress the turkey. Fabric can be from your stash. There is no kit. The videos are available to watch a number of times, so it's a non pressure class. (Basically, each virtual class is less than \$8.00) It's a private site for paid class attendees.

If you are an embroiderer, there are many quilt shops offering **virtual Kimberbell classes.** The advantages are not packing your embroidery unit and machine, the price of the class is less expensive than an in person class, and if you fall behind, you can sew after class to catch up since your machine is at home with you. The shops ship kits, which are included in the cost of the class. You have time to prep your fabric, and you are ready to sew! My Girlfriends QuiltShop - <a href="https://mygirlfriendsquiltshoppe.com/">https://mygirlfriendsquiltshoppe.com/</a> is great. The owner of the shop is the sister of the owner of Kimberbell. Due to the time change from Utah, class doesn't begin till 12 noon and ends around 6 pm. They also answer questions as one sews. It's a private Face book site for class attendees

Meetings. Everyone was very pleased with the way the October meeting went. November meeting will be held at Clawson United Methodist Church on Saturday, November 21, beginning at 9am.followed by open sew until 3pm. Program will include Quilter's Bingo. Be sure to make and bring your bingo "cards" with you. See October Newsletter for instructions. December meeting will be Thursday, December 17. It will not be a potluck. Discussion is ongoing as to how to celebrate the holiday season during pandemic restrictions. If you have any ideas please convey them to Jean Schlegelmann or any of the Board. Ideas that have been suggested include a cookie exchange, a recipe exchange doing something special with Show 'n Tell.
