


Theresa Nielsen will chair the silent auction at our quilt show. More info will be given on this. Let's get sewing on those mini quilts.

CAMEO Guild Meeting Minutes: October 21, 2021

President Carole Gilbert called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, and led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Charity: Linda Wallace: The charity committee has kits and instructions for the Haven bags. Please sew and fill for either awoman, infant, small boy or small girl. Fill with dollar store items, toiletries, book, word search, etc. Please return at November's Guild meeting. Pin a slip of paper w/ note indicating it is for (Woman/boy/girl/infant). Haven also accepts small toiletries from hotels.

Membership report: Marie Weisserman – Please pick up your membership packet with roster/bylaws when you sign in today.

Raffle Quilt Drawing for our Covid Relief Quilt: 999 tickets were sold (1 was damaged) Pat Fisher, friend of Jean Schlegelmann won the quilt. Jean will see if Pat will come to the November guild meeting to be presented and accept the quilt.

Raffle Quilts for our Quilt Show April of 2022. We will be selling 3000 tickets. *See note further on in report.

Saturday's workshop has 13 people signed up, there are still openings.

V.P. Scheduling: Loreen Garrison: Introduced Valina James our speaker for the evening. She presented a trunk show of her collage quilts made from Laura Heine technique/patterns and explained the supplies we will need to bring on Saturday. A handout was provided. The pattern included in the kit also has two other collage quilt designs. Quilting through the adhesive Steam-a-Seam 2 can be challenging. Important tips were shared for quilting, such as a MR-5 needle and a Teflon needle. Typical thread used in quilting is a 40-weight thread. You can also mount these collages on an 18 X 20 canvas if you don't want to make it as a quilt. View and touch the quilts displayed, please don't pick at the edges of the fabric. Quilter Barb Lusk suggested a silicone treatment on the needle for quilting these - "Sewers Aid". Thank you to Valina for an informative and inspiring presentation. Notice – the kit fee should be \$40.00 check, payable to CAMEO on Saturday.

Break for fellowship; called back to order at 8:11 pm

<u>Presidents Report – Carole Gilbert:</u> The Sewing Expo flyer is available, and a few free tickets are available, see Carole if you want a free ticket. Ann Arbor quilt guild is having a big fabric sale.

Recording Secretary's report: Louise McCormick-Glazier 1) correcting the date of the Cameo Board Transitional meeting, it was June 24th, 2021 (not June 16 as printed.) 2) The missing name in the minutes from our September 16 guild meeting: Sharon Cratsenberg proposed the name "Hanging by a Thread" for our Quilt Show. The Quilt show logo needs revision.

<u>Treasurer's Report: Janeen Sharpe</u> Our current balance was reported. Our budget for fiscal year from July 30, 2021 to June 30, 2022 was presented. Janine Sharpe discussed the budget and the estimated shortfall.. *After discussion, it was decided to sell **4000** tickets for the 2 raffle quilts. It is also anticipated that new members will help the bottom line. Voting on Budget: A motion was made by Jackie Considine to approve, and seconded by Kathy Debien. All approved.

<u>V.P. Scheduling: Loreen Garrison:</u> November 18 speaker: Kathy S. Hyde – Portrait and Figurative quilts December: Potluck, January: Project B.E.T.H. February: Whistle Stop (volunteer presenters needed) March: Nancy McNally lecture and workshop – Rock around the block. April 21: – quilt show set-up May: no speaker scheduled, June: Potluck/Elections.

<u>Programs: Jean Schlegelmann:</u> The January Project BETH will be Drunkard's Path. B=Block, E=Examples, T=Techniques, H=History. May program: members' Trunk Show.

Challenge (Mystery Bag) Barb Lusk: At our November meeting, she will sell the \$1.00 scrap bags left over from the garage sales. Participants can add one other fabric (i.e., background), make a quilt (any size). Please email Barb Lusk or Rosemary Spatafora and let them know if you are interested

Membership: Marie Weisserman: We now have 45 members, welcome to 4 new members this evening.

Quilt Show: Sharon Cratsenberg: The number of vendors is designed to cover the cost of the venue rental. There will be approximately 17 vendors. We will not need a food vendor, as the restaurant is available and has good food, the food prices are comparable. The cost of the catalog, we hope to cover with the Ads sold. Our quilt raffle is the most profitable source of income for the quilt show. There will also be a Silent Auction and a "basket-ticket" auction. Admission fee is set a \$6.00.

The Fall retreat was awesome and looking forward to April Retreat, April 7-10 at Bear Lake. Two gift card chances were drawn from members who attended the retreat, winners were Cathy and Kathy Wilson.

Old business:

<u>Auditors Report: Cheryl Cawley, Jacke Considine and Bark Eaken</u>: Audit completed on Sept 18, 2021. All expenses were accounted for except for one missing receipt for \$40 for stamps. A motion was made to approve the correction to the Audit by Jackie Considine seconded by Kathy Debien. All approved. A further motion to approve the audit was made by Jackie Considine and seconded by Kathy Debien. The motion was approved by all.

The evening concluded with Door prizes, slip of the keyboard and Show and Tell.

Minutes from September 29 Board meeting approved with the following corrections - Jackie Considine to be added as absent to the Sept. 29 minutes; Rosemary Spatafora (not Laurie Johnson) is serving as chair of the Education Committee.

Treasurer - Janeen Sharpe presented the financial report. Janeen requests that she receive a detailed report for each speaker and for each workshop. Also advised that those seeking reimbursement for expenses must present a receipt - not a copy of a receipt.

President's Report - Carole recommended that the Board form a committee to create Standing Rules for the administration of the guild. Standing Rules can be created without changing the Bylaws. Carole Gilbert, Jackie Considine and Lynda Draudt volunteered to serve on a committee to create Standing Rules that will be presented to the general membership at a guild meeting.

Programs - Scheduling - Loreen Garrison was not present but emailed the Executive Board members with a request for approval of \$500 for a lecture by Lynn Carson Harris entitled "Unspoken Truths: The Emotional Impact of Abuse". This lecture is based on a series of mini quilts that Lynn created which focus on the impact of domestic abuse. Jackie Considine moved that the Board approve \$500 for Ms. Harris's lecture to be held in the 2022/23 guild year. Seconded by Barb. Motion passed. Loreen also requested approval of \$600 for a three-hour workshop by Ms. Harris. This item was tabled for a future meeting as members would like more information on the different workshops.

Programs - Facilitator - Carmen Sluter was absent but other Board members reported that there were 15 people at Valina James workshop on Oct. 23. Many favorable comments about Valina's workshop and her lecture.

Membership: Marie Weisserman - Reported currently we have 45 members. Two new members joined at the October meeting. Marie will bring any CAMEO business cards to the November meeting so members can put them in quilt shops, give them out, etc.

Corresponding Secretary - Rosemary reported on cards that she mailed out in October.

Committees

Scrap Bag Challenge - There are 25 bags filled with scraps left over from the garage sales. They will be at the November meeting and will be sold for \$1 each. The Challenge is to use only the fabric in the Scrap Bag plus one additional fabric (background, etc.) to create any quilted item. Minimum size = 18"x18"; no maximum size. The deadline is the March meeting. Barb Lusk will write an article for the newsletter.

Door Prizes - Lynda reported that Door Prizes made \$44 in October and there were 11 prizes.

Emergency Fan Out - Rosemary & Sandy Peiss are on this committee and are seeking a few more people to help with calls/ texts. Barb Lusk and Jackie Considine will help with this.

Quilt Show Update - Sharon Cratsenburg reported that the raffle quilt license has been approved and she will be getting tickets. Tickets will be in packs of 25 instead of packs of 20.

Meeting adjourned at 8:42 p.m. - **Next meeting**, Tuesday, November 23 at 7 p.m. at Jackie Considine's home. Note: January, February and March Board meetings will be on ZOOM.
