PIMENTO CHEESE SPREAD submitted by Pat Baldauf

2 blocks of cheddar cheese, sharp or extra sharp, shredded (approximately 2 cups)

8 oz cream cheese

1/2 c mayonnaise

1/2 tsp garlic powder

1/4 tsp paprika

1/2 tsp onion powder

1/2 tsp dried mustard

4 ounces diced pimentos, drained

With electric mixer, whip cream cheese and mayo together. Add cheddar cheese and continue mixing. Add spices. Stir in pimento. Refrigerate 10-15 minutes before serving.



CAMEO Guild Meeting Minutes September 20, 2018 Clawson United Methodist Church

Meeting called to order by President Sharon Cratsenburg at 7pm. Sharon led the Pledge of Allegiance, welcomed everyone and read Cameo's mission statement.

Board Introduced. The 2018/2019 Board was introduced. President- Sharon Cratsenburg, VP Facilitator-Cheryl Cawley, VP Scheduling-Jan Recinos, VP Membership-Lynda Draudt, Treasurer-Pat Baldauf, Recording Secretary-Ann Bonnelli, Corresponding Secretary-Kathy Debien, Assistant Treasurer-Barb Lusk, Members at Large- Darlene Baer, Judy Murray, Kathy Wilson.

Minutes from Guild Meeting, June 21 were accepted and approved to be signed, dated and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report. Pat Baldauf reported on the month's financial income, \$160.00 and expenses, \$391.32.

Donation. Sharon reported that the Board had voted to donate \$100 each to three organizations. These donations are made at the end of every Guild year. Checks were sent to Clawson United Methodist Church, Bear Lake Camp and Miracle Quilts.

Announcements. Carol Fetsco was at the Wolcott Mill Quilt Show where one of the volunteers complimented Cameo on their last Quilt Show and said it was the best Quilt Show she had been to.

Great Lakes Heritage Quilt Guild is having Kaye England for a lecture October 11 and workshops October 12 (Plates, Wedgies & More) and October 13 (Scrap Manias). The workshops will be held at Clawson United Methodist Church. Contact www.glhq.org to register. On October 5 &6 Barb Lusk is having a quilt show to raise funds for her church, Clawson United Methodist. If you would like to display a quilt, contact her. They do not have to be quilts never shown before. Set up is October 4th. There will be several vendors, not necessarily quilt related, pillows, handbags etc. A group from Remember Me Quilt Show will be there on Saturday. Come and bring your friends.

Audit Committee. Sharon read the committee's report submitted July 24th. The recommendation was made that all receipts must be itemized not placed under general headings.

Round Robin Henya Rachmiel announced a themed row quilt for this year's Round Robin. She had sign-up sheets.

Mystery Quilt. Tina Rink announced that there would be three short mystery quilts this year each just two clues and they will be seasonal. Participants may participate in just one or all three.

Membership Lynda Draudt reported that we had 51 members. She introduced those who had joined today.

Charity Jean Schlegelmann challenged each member to participate in Charity Begins at Home. Each Cameo Member is asked to donate a baby quilt, 36x36 that they have completed, pieced, quilted & bound. Your name will be placed in a jar for each quilt you turn in and in April, a winner will be drawn to receive a prize. As always please wait until they are all set up before handing in donations. We will continue to donate to Haven, Church Layette, Ryan's cases for Smiles formerly Pillowcases ConKerr cancer and Miracle Quilts. Grieving Envelopes they need to find a contact person. Haven bags need to be turned in at the November Meeting, do indicate whether for an infant-boy-girlwoman. Other suggestions from the Membership included Fern Care, a Health Care in Ferndale and Shriner's Hospital

VP Scheduling Jan Recinos reported on speakers she has been considering for the 2019/2010 year.

And for **Research & Information**, asked if there was an interest in visits to Quilt holdings in Greenfield Village and DIA. There was so she will pursue this.

VP Facilitator Cheryl Cawley distributed bookmarks showing speakers through May 2019. There will be five open sew Saturdays, 9am-3pm. Sept 22, Nov 17, Feb 23 Charity Day, March 23 National Quilting Day, and May 18

August minutes were approved, signed, dated and placed on file.

President Sharon Cratsenburg. The donation checks for Bear Lake, Miracle Quilts and Clawson United Methodist Church were given to Kathy Debien, Corresponding Secretary for mailing.

Members of the Retreat Committee, Karla Sutton, Carole Gilbert, Janeen Sharpe, Pat Baldauf with Sharon revisted the Colombiere Center to review arrangements. The Committee will now work on pricing, budgets and registration forms. There is plenty of room, retreat will be open to non-members for \$10 extra.

Hospitality. Coffee will be provided. Kathy Mentkowski has offered to donate a small coffee maker or we have permission to use the Church's small pot. Pitchers of water will also be provided.

Discussed whether with a membership of only 51 we wanted to offer all three special activities, Challenge-Round Robin-Mystery? Decided if members were willing to offer them, then it was up to the membership if they participate.

Fourth special activity is Mentoring Quilting a program that teaches young people to sew and is connected with the Methodist Church. Barb will look into this.

Lynda Draudt. VP Membership There are 51 members registered. Committees are set up and Lynda will send out the list urging Members to choose a chair person as soon as possible and meet to organize their group. Membership folders will be ready for the October meeting. Thereafter all updates will be via email.

Cheryl Cawley VP Facilitator. More discussion on how we can do more to promote the programs and workshops. We need more people to register for Aniko Feher's Workshop in October. Bookmarks listing our programs are available and Members are encouraged to leave them at stores and other guilds.

Jan Recinos VP Scheduler. No speakers signed up for 2019/2020 yet. She has checked in to a behind the scenes tour of Quilts held in the Henry Ford Museum, nothing definitive, there may be a charge of \$200. Should we consider going back to Michigan State for a talk on a different group of Quilts.

Barb Lusk Assistant Treasurer. The Old-fashioned Church Pew Quilt Show, October 5-6 is set to go. There will be at least 120 quilts as well as vendors, food and silent auction.

Member-at-Large Darlene Baer Questions regarding Charity Day. Sharon reported that the Board allocates money, around \$100, for refreshments and/or projects for Charity Day and National Quilt Day. The Committee submits their plans to the Board ahead of time and before the money is allocated.

Member-at-Large Judy Murray, The Library Auction took place at the September Meeting. 1 ½ boxes of books were sold and \$80 was raised. Another auction will be held in October.

Member-at-Large Kathy Wilson Discussed the work of the Door Prizes Committee.

New Business Sharon reported that Tina Rink had fallen and broken her leg.

Discussion of New Members Tea, it has not been well attended in the past.

Need Quilt Show Chairpersons. Should establish dates as soon as possible. Sharon will check with Madison Place and see if April 30-May1 2020 is a possibility. Should our theme reflect our anniversary?

Raffle Quilt Committee should decide on design and ideas of fabric and submit to Board before purchasing anything. Meeting adjourned 9pm.
