

### **OCTOBER GUILD MEETING**

For October's meeting, Linda Wallace will be giving us some background history on the Charity Committee. She will also show us some simple ideas for putting together charity quilts.

I will then lead us in our "Circle of Friends", the topic is "What got me into quilting", so bring a first quilted piece you did or maybe some orphan blocks, whatever it might be that peaked your interest. We want to hear your story.

## NOVEMBER GUILD MEETING - BINGO!

At the November meeting, we will play a game of Quilter's Bingo. This requires you to do some homework before the meeting. We will not supply you with Bingo cards but you will make your own from scraps of fabric and bring your fabric block to November's meeting. You will also need buttons for markers. After playing, the "cards" will be collected to assemble into a Charity quilt. Instructions are reproduced with permission from fonsandporter.com.

If you do not have the exact fabric - trade with a friend. Thanks to Rosemary Spatafora for the game suggestion.

**Directions for one 10-1/2" fabric block.** This is your "game card." **DO NOT GLUE TO CARDBOARD - keep it a quilt block.** 

Each print must be chosen from one of the following categories (you choose which five prints for each color):

batik	holiday	plaid
dot	leaf	solid
floral	metallic	star
geometric	novelty	stripe
heart	paisley	1930s print

#### Cut 2-1/2" squares from each color family:

Five (2-1/2") squares assorted yellow and orange prints

Five (2-1/2") squares assorted red prints

Five (2-1/2") squares assorted blue prints

Five (2-1/2") squares assorted green prints


Four (2-1/2") squares assorted pink and purple prints One (2-1/2") square black print (center "Free" space"

You chose which five prints you can use in each color family. For example, you will end up with one square each of Yellow/Orange batik, Yellow/Orange dot, Yellow/Orange floral, Yellow/Orange geometric, and Yellow/Orange novelty. Then cut your remaining colors in the prints you have available.

#### **Block Assembly**

- 1. Referring to photos of blocks, join five yellow/orange print squares to make one column. In the same manner, make one red, one blue, and one green column.
- 2. Join two pink/purple squares. Make two pink/purple pairs. Join one pink/purple pair to each side of black square to complete pink/purple column.
- 3. Join columns, placing pink/purple row in center, to complete one Bingo Game Card block.

You can sew your block at retreat and trade fabrics!

## CAMEO Guild Meetings Minutes September 19, 2020

Nineteen members met in Janeen Sharp's backyard. President Sharon Cratsenburg called the meeting to order at 12:15pm.and began by thanking Janeen for her hospitality and presenting her with some flowers. In lieu of the Pledge of Allegiance Sharon offered a prayer. She welcomed everyone including two new members. As many had not seen each other since February and everyone was wearing a mask, we quickly introduced ourselves.

Slip of the Keyboard was conducted by Jackie Speer.

The February Minutes were approved and placed on file.

Jackie Considine presented the Treasurers Report.

**The Audit Committee**: Cheryl Cawley, Barbara Eaken, and Kathleen Barlow met in August and found the books to be in order.

**Laurie Johnson** gave the Membership report. We have 40 members of whom 5 are associate members.

**Sharon Cratsenburg** reported that the Fall Retreat at Bear Lake will be held as long as we have 15 people registered. It will be held October 29-November 1. Cost for members \$110. There will be plenty of room, sleeping one person per cubicle (last time we had 2) and only 4 people per cabin. Each person will have their separate sewing table. Sharon needs to know if you are going by the end of the month.

**Linda Wallace** discussed Charity activities and proposed that we keep the same organizations as last year. Which would be Haven House (November), Miracle Quilts and Layette (April). Linda emphasized that all articles should be for <u>new borns</u>, onesies/diapers etc new born\_size. There was discussion as to what could be accepted this Covid year. The suggestion was made that we make placemats for the Meals on Wheels program instead of Haven. Laurie will check on the requirements. Linda reminded us that "Charity Begins at Home Quilts" no longer have to be quilted by the donor. That person may achieve the quilting by <u>paying</u> someone else to quilt it but the quilting cannot be <u>donated</u> by another person. The drawing was held for the Charity Begins at Home Quilts and the winner was Carol Herzberg. Her prize was 25 Fat Quarters

Carole Carroll from Miracle Quilts described the wide-ranging activities of Miracle Quilts and showed some Quilts that had been donated. She then presented a quilt to Vietnam Veteran John Ciecko.

Laurie Johnson showed the Cameo Together Quarantine Quilt. Blocks were donated by members, she mentioned that the late Shirley Gugan had donated 7 blocks, then Laurie put them together and Barb Lusk quilted it with an all in Our House theme.

Mask challenge was held and prizes given for the most creative mask, the mask making a super statement, and the Fashion Statement mask.

There was then Show n' Tell and that was followed by the enjoyment of a Cameo Anniversary cake. Slip of the Keyboard winner was Jan Recinos.

Meeting adjourned at 2.45pm.
