



### CAMEO Guild Meetings Minutes June 17, 2021 Meeting at Royal Oak Senior Center Patio at 6 pm

President Sharon Cratsenburg called the meeting to order at 6:15 pm., led the pledge of Allegiance, welcomed everyone to a long awaited in person meeting. She thanked everyone for hanging in during the past difficult eighteen months. Twenty-nine members were present.

The transitional Board Meeting will be at Janeen's on June 24<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30pm. Please bring all officer manuals and reports. The May Minutes were approved and placed on file.

**Sharon Cratsenburg**. The garage sale raised \$1186 and 60 raffle tickets were sold. During the sale we were asked if we could participate in a Heritage Day Festival in Richmond, July 27and/or 28, we would display our quilts, sit and sew and sell our raffle tickets. However, they decided we could not sell our raffle tickets and it sounded as though there would be more interest in old cars and farm equipment. The members voted not to participate. The next garage sale is August 7 at Rosemary Spatafora's in Pleasant Ridge. Donations are still needed, any new or nearly new quilting or craft items, Rosemary will arrange a pick-up time at the Clawson Church, details later. The Covid Relief Raffle Quilt will be displayed and raffle tickets sold. Drawing will take place, October 21, 2021. Please pick up your tickets today to sell to friends and family. Suggestion that tickets could be sold at the Clawson City Festival, Sharon will ask Theresa Nielsen to check for permission.

Bear Lake Retreat contract is signed, October 14-17, 2021. There will be two meals brunch and dinner each day.

Audit Committee was appointed Cheryl Cawley, Barb Eaken and Kathy Mentkowski. Approved by Membership.

Laurie Johnson reported that 26 members had renewed and 5 Associates

Jackie Considine presented the Treasurers Report. It was approved and filed.

Jean Schlegelmann. Reported that we hope to have our regular in person meetings beginning in September at Clawson United Methodist Church. The Laura Heine workshop and trunk show is booked for October.

Linda Wallace reported on our charitable donations this year. We donated 120 pillowcases, \$1000worth of goods for the layette, \$2,086 Miracle Quilts and 84 Haven bags.

Quilt Show 2022. Sharon had nothing to report.

A question arose from the Membership about a Board decision to split our annual \$300 donation between two agencies rather than three. Member felt we had so little funds that she questioned us making any donation let alone raising it for two organizations. <u>President Carole Gilbert</u> called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm, and led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Carole welcomed everyone and reported an enjoyable vacation trip.

We enjoyed a Meet and Greet dice game with each group of 6 rolling a die and answering a quilt-related question.

V.P. Facilitator Report: Carmen Sluter: was not present, had another meeting.

<u>V.P. Scheduling: Loreen Garrison:</u> Programs planned for the year – Speaker for October 21 is Valina James, a certified Laura Heine instructor. Workshop is October 23, cost is \$30 + cost of kit \$30 or \$40 learning an applique technique. Need a minimum of 8 persons for the workshop to run.

November 18 program will be speaker: Kathy S. Hyde – Portrait and Figurative quilts December Potluck, January – no program scheduled, February Whistle Stop, March Nancy McNally lecture and workshop – Rock around the block. April – quilt show Hanging Day – everyone will help with setting up the show instead of a meeting on April 21. The show will be April 22 & 23. May no speaker scheduled, June – Potluck.

Membership report: Marie Weisserman – We welcome 3 new members tonight, going from 38 to 41 members.

<u>Charity Committee: Linda Wallace</u> – Proposed we continue with Miracle Quilts, the church Layette Program, and bags of personal items for The Haven. There will be a drawing for the "Charity begins at Home" Challenge. To qualify, quilts must be completed entirely on your own, or paid for the quilting. Alternatively making 8-10 pillowcases for donation. Charity quilts can be Baby – 36 X 36 up to Queen size.

<u>Sharon Cratsenburg: Retreat, Quilt show.</u> Bear Lake Retreat can optionally begin Thursday Oct 14<sup>th</sup>, for extra \$15.00; 2 meals/ day Friday & Saturday. Sunday breakfast. Cost is \$110. 15 persons = 4 people/cabin. Mask policy: if not vaccinated, wear mask at all times; if vaccinated wear mask when moving around. Garage sale leftovers were donated to Miracle Quilts' garage sale and a Grosse Pointe church. Fat Quarters were retained for our quilt show. Our quilt show this year will be at the American Polish Cultural Center, located at 15 Mile & Dequindre. The rental cost is \$3,000. This is for 3 halls together. They will allow people to purchase food at their restaurant, no outside food vendor will be needed. The deposit is \$1000, the contract has been signed. We previously had 17 vendors for the cancelled quilt show, will need tables; the lighting is good at this venue. Two quilts be raffled, license cost will be \$100.00. We need people to do jobs for the show: silent auction of mini quilts, publicity. Name of the Quilt Show: "Hanging by a Thread" was proposed by Sharon Cratsenburg. Placement of vendors; Check-in will be Kathy Debien.

<u>Treasurer's Report: Janeen Sharpe</u> - This year, our Assistant treasurer will be more involved in the treasurer duties. Jackie will have forms to turn in for money and for reimbursement. Report Garage sale results #1) last fiscal year + #2) this fiscal year total = \$1,852. Our total balance is currently \$10,737.90

Insurance fees are rising and we will get a new liability policy covering meeting at the building, with membership of less than 50 persons. cost is around \$200.00 and insurance coverage starts October 3<sup>rd</sup>. One of our new members offered to review the policy.

### Other business:

The Covid Relief Quilt will be raffled at our October meeting, at 7:30 pm. Members who have ticket stubs outstanding are encouraged to turn them in asap.

Our block of the month challenge is ongoing until December. Members are encouraged to show their blocks at show and tell.

Door prize drawings and show and tell concluded the meeting.

The September Board meeting will be held Wednesday September 29<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm

#### VP Facilitator Report: Carmen Sluter -

October guild meeting (10-21-21) is a presentation by Valina James, a certified Laura Heine instructor in fabric collage. The workshop is Saturday, 10-23-21, the subject is a vintage sewing machine. Cost of the workshop is \$30 payable to CAMEO quilters guild. The kit for the workshop is an additional \$30 payable on the day of the workshop to presenter Valina James.

<u>President Carole Gilbert</u> read an email from <u>VP Scheduling: Loreen Garrison</u> who was not present. November meeting is a presentation by Deborah S. Hyde (11 -18-21). Deborah Hyde is a portrait art quilter. Originally scheduled for November 2020. No workshop.

December is planned to be a Pot luck; January and future programs are under consideration, taking into account bad weather inwinter months, which makes travel difficult. Potential budget will not permit a large number of outside speakers. February may be whistle stop; so far, no members have volunteered to present a technique.

The post office box has been checked daily, in anticipation of our insurance contract. One of our new members will help by reviewing the contract. Price of first -class postage went up in August.

The newsletter committee will be Sharon, Ann, and Jackie. Communications will be Janeen Sharpe.

Jackie Speer will be liaison for the April Retreat as well as National Quilt Day. Laurie Johnson, as chair of the Education committee will be the liaison. Carole Gilbert will be Fundraising liaison. Carmen Sluter will chair the publicity committee. The Charity Day committee is composed of Darlene, Jolene and Linda Wallace. Special Committees needing chairs/liaisons/members are President's Quilt, Fat Quarter, Challenge, Hearts and Hugs, Fabulous Finds, Spring Raffle Quilts, Fan Out

#### Sharon Cratsenburg- Quilt Show:

The plans are coming together, number of vendors will be about 15 to 17; she needs to measure the space again. There is a restaurant at the venue (American Polish Cultural Center) so we won't need a food vendor. Linda Wallace is handling tickets for the raffle quilts, Judy and Darlene are making up baskets. A silent auction coordinator is needed. Sheryl Cawley is working on the Fat Quarter Baskets.

Garage Sale Report: the idea was great and profits were good, but it was a lot of work.

Carole Gilbert brought up <u>Unfinished business</u>: Set up for the retreat; transportation of supplies and materials. Linda will transport legs for the tables, Carmen will take and ironing board, Sharon will take the irons and some cords. They will meet at the church Wednesday, October 13<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 pm.

#### Future board meetings:

There was discussion of holding some of the board meetings via Zoom during November, December, January and February. The weather, time of day and travel distance were all considerations.
