

**Lynda Draudt** has been busy putting our membership lists together, so if you received a call from her about a committee, please be sure to respond back. It takes every member to make our guild successful.



After the June, 2018 Annual Meeting, the Board has decided to dispense of the library books by having a silent auction. This has been done in the past to reduce the size of the library. We will have two auctions over the year, the first in September.

At the September meeting we will have half of the books set out around the room, with a card attached to each offering. ### QUILT SHOW BY THE GREATER ANN ARBOR QUILT GUILD

Many CAMEO members turned out to see the Ann Arbor (GAAQG) quilt show July 28-29. It was great seeing so many familiar faces. There were roomfuls of fine quilts, and a wide array of vendors. The quilts in the main gallery were thoughtfully curated/hung by guild member Kaye Whittington; each pair of facing quilts complimented each other. Some were on the same theme or design or color array. Others juxtaposed contrasting treatments, e.g. modern and traditional treatments of a theme. Many of the quilts had various levels of embellishment, ranging from a few discrete beads or buttons, to crazy quilts, to a wool quilt almost entirely covered with intricate applique, embroidery, and beading. There were also a number of quilts using fused applique. Some were Laura Heine patterns, a rooster, a turtle, and a butterfly/flower; others were originals. I was also impressed by quilts that used a relatively simple repeating pattern, but achieved elegance and impact through carefully chosen fabrics emphasizing color and texture, thoughtful arrangement, and meticulous piecing.

Of note, all the quilts in the two long side corridors were charity quilts, ready to be donated to the Safe House Domestic Violence Project. Many of these quilts could just as easily have hung in the main galleries. A guild member told me that after each meeting, they have a sew-in, and small groups work together as teams to cut and sew these fine quilts. Perhaps we could display more of our charity quilts during show and tell, to appreciate and inspire each other in our charity quilt efforts.

There were other interesting special displays. In one of them, several quilters were given the same photograph to use as the inspiration for a small quilt. Then each of the quilts was given to another quilter to use for inspiration for another quilt. And those quilts became the inspiration for yet more quilts. It was sort of a quilt "telephone" process, with each quilter another link in the sequence. Overall, the show was an inspiration and a challenge.

### Aniko Feher October Workshop Supply list

- Bring photo of your choice: already enlarged. Your chosen photo have to be clear with good definition of features (must have some defining shadows but not too dark, no shadows in the background to hide the outlines). Black and white pictures OK, it should have a good composition. The photo will have to be enlarged so that it is at least 8.5x11 but not larger than 11x14.
- Clear Mylar or acetate, 1-2 sheets 11x14 (art supply stores carry it)
- Sharpie permanent markers, black ultra fine point
- blender pen alcohol pens to erase permanent markings
- poster board 22x28, masking tape beige (blue or green doesn't stick to fabric)
- muslin 20x26 piece, we will "build" our image on it
- fabrics choices, bring small pieces but a great variety
- paper scissor, sharp and small for intricate cutting
- paper, pencil and ballpoint pen -freezer paper, 1 yard piece
- Saral transfer paper
- mini iron with stand (optional if you use Steam a Seam 2 light)
- fusible web: 2 yards or 2 packs Steam a Seam 2 light
- water color pencils: black, white, red and brown
- bring a cushion for your chair (student suggestion)
- Teflon pressing sheet or parchment paper for ironing fusible, tweezer (to handle small pieces) long and tapered is best
- 3 paper lunch bags (marked TRASH, EXTRA FABRIC, PATTERN)
- extension cord for mini irons

With any questions or help to choose the right photo please e-mail me at quiltsbyaniko@gmail.com or call me 248-579-8956. No sewing machine is needed in class. Bring your camera and take pictures of the finished quilt sample and details

To complete the project at home you will need: sewing machine, stabilizer any brand, light weight, tear away works best, invisible thread smoke color, colored threads (optional) to enhance the project.

Purchase of *Labor of Love* booklet is recommended, but not mandatory.

Meeting was held at the home of President Sharon Cratsenburg, preceded by a pot-luck dinner. Meeting was called to order at 7:40pm. Present were Sharon Cratsenburg, Ann Bonnell, Kathy Wilson, Pat Baldauf, Judy Murray, Lynda Draudt, Barbara Lusk, Jan Recinos, Darlene Baer, Cheryl Cawley. Absent Kathy Debian.

June Minutes were approved and placed on file.

**President Sharon Cratsenburg** confirmed with Pat Baldauf that the PO Box payment had been made. She also read the report from Pat Pillot for the Audit Committee.

**Lynda Draudt, VP Membership** There are 43 members registered. Lynda is working on committees as they come in and is working on Membership folders.

**Cheryl Cawley, VP Facilitator** September meeting will include the Library Auction and a Make-n-Take display board. Board Members are asked to bring glue guns and glue sticks if they have them. Barb Lusk will request 10 long tables be set up for this. Later we will have the business meeting sitting around the tables. Board Members are also reminded to bring the snacks for September. Discussion on how we can do more to promote the programs and workshops. Suggested we have bookmarks that can be left at shops and guilds. Laurie Johnson will be consulted.

**Jan Recinos, VP Scheduler** Jan is collecting data prior to presenting speakers for 2019/2020. She would welcome suggestions from the membership for speakers.

**Pat Baldauf, Treasurer** New bank signatures are in place. Pat distributed a preliminary budget and requested any additions or changes. Traditionally Cameo has made \$100 gifts to five non-profit organizations, these were not made last year and the books have been closed. Therefore the Board voted to make just three donations immediately and to review the gift giving in January. Thus \$100 each will be made to Bear Lake Camp, Clawson United Methodist Church, Miracle Quilts.

**Member-at-Large Judy Murray** Judy has plans for the Library Auction, at September meeting, in hand. She needs some time with the book collection.

**Kathy Wilson** reported that there is already a meeting set up for the Charity Committee on September 8.

**Retreat** A problem has arisen because the April Membership Meeting had to be changed because of Easter 2019. The retreat was changed from the April 26-28 date that had been booked at Bear Lake, they are fully booked for April, May and early June, the only date available is March 29-31. Many Members have indicated that they would not be comfortable risking the weather at Bear Lake. Sharon has been investigating other venues. Waters Edge, Howell; Creative Passions, Chesaning; the Cloisters, Sebawaing The Springs, Gladwin. She will email members with the Board's suggestions.

**Liaisons** Board Member Liaison responsibilities were discussed and assigned. Lynda will print for the Member packets.


