Door Prizes Table



CAMEO Garage Sales - Rosemary Spatafora

This past summer CAMEO hosted two garage sales - the first on June 12 at Sharon Cratsenburg's home in Romeo and the second on August 7 at Rosemary Spatafora's home in Pleasant Ridge. Both sales ran from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and were well attended by quilters, sewers and random curious garage sale patrons.

Our June 12th sale netted \$986 and we sold \$60 in raffle tickets on that day. Our August 7 sale netted 567.05 and we sold \$100 in raffle tickets on that day. So our grand total from both sales is \$1553.05 in sales and \$160 in raffle tickets.

Thanks also to everyone who donated fabric, books, patterns, notions, etc. These sales truly could not have happened without your generous donations of great items!

We did have some left over fabric which we donated to the "Pieces Be With You" ministry at St. Paul Evangelical Lutheran Church in Grosse Pointe Farms. "Pieces Be With You" is a group of women that have been meeting for almost 20 years to learn to quilt and to make quilts for various charities both local and around the world. In the early hours of June 26, 2021, the east side of Detroit and the Grosse Pointes received more than 7 inches of rain in just 3 hours. St. Paul experienced 7 feet of contaminated water in the basement workroom where PBWY housed all of their materials and supplies. This quilting group lost everything in the flood waters. Needless to say, they were so very happy to receive the leftovers from our garage sales.

We also had a number of books and patterns left from our sales which we donated to Carole Carroll for the Miracle Quilts Garage Sale on August 28.

So our garage sales accomplished good things all around. We made some money for our guild and we helped out some very worth causes with what we had left.
