

Royal Oak Library to Exhibit CAMEO Miniature/ Small Quilts in October

The Royal Oak Library is looking forward to hosting a display of CAMEO quilts during the month of October, 2024. The quilts will be displayed in the library's locked glass display case that is just inside the library's entrance. This is a high traffic area and will be a great opportunity to get exposure for CAMEO and hopefully will draw new members to our guild.

In order for our display to be a success we are looking for quilts that meet certain specifications as follows:

Due to limited space in the display case quilts need to be either miniatures or small quilts (no larger than 24" x 24" and smaller is better). We can also accept small quilted items like bags, pin cushions, pillows, hot pads, etc.

Note: Below are a couple of photos of our past displays so you can get an idea of how it will look.

• It will be really helpful if your quilt has a sleeve on the back for hanging.

Be sure to put your name on your item. Either a sewn-on label, a signature, or a tag pinned to the item will work.

Please bring your items to the September 19 meeting.

What 99.9% of Sewing Rooms Gail's Gewing Room REALLY Look Like

A Clean Sewing Room, Said No One Ever

Well, once I put everything away after the Crazy quilt lecture, I could actually see the top of my cutting table. But the room still lacked organization, there were a few things I couldn't find. So, I started in a corner of the room with a small box, in the box I would put scraps of fabric I didn't want, patterns, etc. Most quilters I know love scraps, so things moved along swiftly at first, but then I needed a larger box. So out of the corner I went to a larger box for the scraps and a closet full of UFO's, I sure hope no one is watching me. I mean, so many UFO's, what is a guilter to do? Well, make a list and finish them. There were lots of redwork projects, the embroidery was complete, just not finished. There were several quilt tops to be finished, a purse with no handles, the list goes on. Wait, I need to make a list for this to be official. The guilt police are going to inquire about, why is it, how did it get so long? In case you're wondering, I spent a week in my sewing room, and of course I visited the laundry area once or twice in my travels since I have to walk that way to get to my secret stash of all the other fabrics. Yeah, I have a stash, all quilters do. On the cutting table there were now three very large stacks of fabric. Decisions, decisions, what goes and what stays. I turned on the iron to press some Sunbonnet Sue blocks that I would like to get done and also the fabric for the sashing. Those blocks had been completed, the only thing left to do was trim the edges. I set them aside after pressing. Why didn't I put the fabric for the sashing with the blocks, I have no idea. My sewing room is much neater, but I can't find a darn thing, because it's too neat. My UFO list is a work in progress, I think I'm on number 28 of unfinished projects, don't laugh. But I can't find the fabric anywhere, or the missing chocolate that I keep for emergencies, the new rotary cutter blades or my phone which must be hidden under one of those stacks of fabric. In my house, every dish has a place in the cupboard, every dog has a bed but I can't explain the mess in my sewing room which I vow to never clean again.

Meeting was called to order at 7:06 pm by Barb Lusk. We are looking forward to a great year ahead; last year our Charity efforts were outstanding, as if our 50 members were 150! Keep up the good work with Charity and help plan our April 2025 Quilt Show! Welcome to all our new board members, and thank you for joining us tonight!

Cleaning the Closet: Date has been set for Thursday, September 12 at 11:00 am followed by lunch together. Team will be Barb, Jean, Louise, and Chris S. Note that we should discard or donate the leaky Keurig coffee maker. Louise has repaired an ironing board broken feet. There are two additional spare feet replacements. *Check for round tablecloths, small paper plates, napkins, large water kettle for first meeting.

September Welcome Back Tea: Barb has arranged for her neighbor LaVonne Ogilvy to speak at the beginning of our September 19th, 2024 meeting about the guild's donation of 12 quilts to American House Residential Home. LaVonne will speak for 15-20 minutes. We will be serving tea, tea sandwiches and pastries/treats. Each member brings own teacup/ saucer. Sharon will create a Google Drive spreadsheet for board to communicate how many teapots and what treats they will bring. We will have 6 round tables. Plan for 35-40 people.

Charity Day – Michigan Honor Flight Sew-in – Saturday, September 21 – 9 am to 3 pm.

Kits are being prepared for our first charity quilt day, the Saturday after our Thursday night meeting. Bring your sewing machine (& thread, needles). If you can't be there Saturday, contact Linda Wallace to ask her to bring a kit (or two) to the Thursday night meeting. Thanks to Linda, Betty Buscar, Peggy Wanat and Jean Schlegelmann for helping prepare the kits. Our goal is to exceed the 40 we completed last year.

Treasurer report - Janeen Sharpe: a deposit was recently made, and more membership dues are coming in. Balance will be provided later.

Membership committee - Sharon Cratsenburg: We are at 27 members now, expect to gain more at our first meeting. Sharon to reach out to some past guests. All board and current members encouraged to welcome guests and invite them to join. Our welcome tea is our first opportunity to do so. Suggestion was made to reach out to invite the guests who came on the Royal Oak Seniors AQS trip (if Carol Herzberg still has the list).

Corresponding Secretary Report: Louise reached out to the Troy Historic Village RE: their Handcrafters Fair held in August (already past) so we can get earlier notification and participate in the future. They will also notify us of any crafters monthly meetings if they decide to hold any.

Mail box: Letter from Haven thanking for our support and offering donation options/ideas.

Letter from State of Michigan for licensing will be given to Treasurer – Janeen, other insurance and mail box fees have been forwarded to Janeen over the summer. Memberships renewals have been forwarded to Sharon. Assorted credit card offers are shredded and discarded. Birthday cards have been sent out to members. There appears to be only one mailbox key, in possession of Corr. Sec., if we had another, it is missing. Cost of a duplicate is \$18.00. Discussed keeping new spare in possession of Treasurer, as they also need access to the mailbox. Louise will set up and run the ZOOM at meetings, including the short presentation at the beginning of our September meeting. A sympathy card was mailed to former member Linda Watkins to ackowledge the passing of her sister.

Quilt Show - Sharon C.: Working on list of committees needed, such as Raffle Quilt/ tickets, Door Prizes, Hanging Quilts, taking down, Registering the Quilts, Vendors. Discussion of the "Baskets" offered for donation – do we want to do again? There is a large donation of quilt fabric we will be offering for sale; Mini quilts – did not do well - but can be offered for sale and decorate the 'booth.' A committee will be needed to measure and price all the donated fabric.

Request this be posted for Facebook: Cameo 2024-2025 UFO Challenge. "We are having a UFO challenge this year to help motivate you to finish those quilts you previously started. Finish up those nagging "to-do items" and finish up those quilts for our upcoming quilt show April 2025. 1) at October meeting, bring a list (or email) your UFO's and turn in to Cheryl. 2) For every quilt you fully complete and bring to show and tell, you will receive one entry for a gift card drawing held at our June meeting. (You can also have Cheryl show your "quilt finishes" anonymously, if you are too shy to go up on stage!) But get them done by April!!! So they can be entered in the quilt show. There will be a drawing for prizes.

October program: Terri Bertolan, Quilts of Valor 7 pm. *Need to find out how much time Terri will need and what other demonstrations need to be made. Possible Trunk show of Quilts of Valor will be included. Ask Linda Wallace to speak about the results of Honor Flight Quilt in from September. Laura Ball Carey has volunteered to take photos of quilts presented (during programs and show and tell) and text or email to Louise for posting on Facebook. They can also be included in the newsletter.

*Someone needs to reach out to Rosemary Spatafora RE: the October display case at the Royal Oak Library. What size mini-quilts, how many does she want from members, and when needed?

V.P. Scheduling – Theresa Nielsen: We do not want to lose potential members by forgetting to welcome them and invite them back. Talk to the new visitors, and introduce yourselves. The tea is an ideal time to do this, but every meeting. *Let's have Barb invite the new members to introduce themselves at the **beginning** of the meeting, prior to the speaker, as visitors tend to leave after the speaker finishes. Suggestion was made to give a Fat Quarter as a welcome gift for visitors.

30th Anniversary Quilt Challenge for our April Quilt show. Theresa will write an article with specifics for the newsletter. There will be prizes. She would like to recruit judges from outside our membership. Quilts should be finished by March 2025 to be entered in contest and quilt show.

Fall Retreat – Sharon Cratsenberg: Our Fall retreat is Thursday through Sunday, October 24th – 27th. The fee for 3 nights (includes Thur. dinner, Fri & Sat breakfast + dinner, and Sunday breakfast) is \$165.50 members, \$175.50 non-members. The fee for 2 nights Friday to Sunday, with meals is \$121.20 members, \$131.50 non-members. Registration form will be sent to membership. E-mail Sharon ASAP if you will go, we need at least 25. Check and registration form due by October 1, 2024.

Other Business:

Treasurer: Janeen noted that any prizes planned need to be budgeted for. Please get your expense requests emailed to the board as soon as possible so Janeen can create the budget. Also, she will need a list of all our meetings at the church to determine expected rental costs. It was noted that all the meetings are listed on the website and information can be found there. The contract with the church lists the fees for Thursday night (\$125.00) and Saturdays (\$175.00). There are no conflicts with Easter dates.

Liaisons: note that the board are Liaisons for the various committees and will be assigned committees to check in on. See if they have met, what their budget needs if any are, if they have questions or reports to share. **Members at large** are liaisons to the general membership and are to convey any questions or concerns to the board.
