


CAMEO 30 Year Anniversary Challenge

CAMEO QUILTERS GUILD MEETING

Clawson City Hall October 17, 2024 7pm

Membership Chair Sharon Cratsenburg led the meeting for President Barb Lusk, who was ill. The meeting was held at Clawson City Hall because of a water main problem at the church. Meeting was also broadcast on Zoom.

VP Facilitator Cheryl Cawley introduced our speaker, Terri Bertalan, a CAMEO member, who talked about her group "Stitching Sisters Quilts of Valor."

A Quilt of Valor presentation was made to Dane Nielsen (husband of member Theresa Nielsen) for his service in the Air Force.

Charity: Linda Wallace and Jean Schlegelmann, committee co-chairs, showed 40 quilts made for the Michigan Honor Flight. CAMEO members took 18 quilts to attach binding. Two quilts were presented to Terri's group.

Hospitality break

The September minutes were accepted and recorded.

Audit: Theresa Nielsen reported on the yearly audit - all was in order.

Programs: VP Facilitator Cheryl Cawley described the UFO Challenge.

November's speaker will be Norma Stark who will lecture on curved piecing. The workshop will be "Metro Hoops", an easier way to sew a Wedding Ring quilt. As of this date, seven people were interested in the workshop.

VP Membership Sharon Cratsenburg reported that 29 people were present at this meeting which included two guests and three people viewing by Zoom.

Retreat: Need attendees to take irons, cutting mats and electrical cords to the retreat. Cheryl gave Janeen Sharpe the key to the church closet.

Quilt Show: Sharon also described the Basket Auction and Mini Quilt Auction for the Quilt Show. She expressed a need for help in putting on this event.

Treasurer's Report: Janeen Sharpe described this year's budget versus last year's. Last year, we were \$424 in the red with cost cutting. If we follow this year's budget, we will be \$3,109 dollars in the red. The rent is higher this year and we have fewer members paying dues. Motion to approve the budget by Darlene Baer; the motion passed.

CAMEO QUILTERS GUILD OCTOBER BOARD MEETING

November 7, 2024 by Zoom

All Board memebrs were present except Cheryl Cawley who was at another guild meeting recruiting for November's workshop. Chris Schulte joined us later in the meeting.

Meeting was started at 7pm by President Barb Lusk who thanked everyone for organizing and running October's Guild meeting in her absence. Barb asked Corresponding Secretary Louise McCormick Glazer to send a thank you note to the Clawson City Manager.

Treasurer's Report: Janeen stated that the fall retreat had been paid in October. We have approximately \$13,000 total.

VP Membership Sharon Cratsenburg reported on renewing the copyright for the guild logo. The logo is currently registered and will cost the guild \$1,000 to copyright for another ten years. That cost includes legal fees. The money is due by November 25, 2024. Guild members need to vote because the amount is over \$750. Majority of Board members feel the cost is too high. If another organization appropriates our logo and copyrights it, we could just design a newer logo. Janeen Sharpe will research costs if we were to renew without a lawyer's help. Sharon to get break down of costs from the law firm handling this issue.

Membership: 40 members have joined the guild. Membership packet has been emailed to the guild. Sharon will take corrections at November's Guild meeting and do them all at one time, then email a revised roster. There was positive feedback about the Fall Retreat.

Quilt Show: Raffle Quilt is done, Jean Schlegelmann has it to put on a label and a sleeve. The quilting was done by Barb Lusk. Jean will bring the quilt to November's meeting for photos. Linda Wallace and Jean Schlegelmann took measurements of the venue for the quilt show. Sharon will figure out how many vendors will fit. There will be a Quilt Show Committee meeting after Thanksgiving. Laurie Johnson got the cost for a quarter page ad from the Country Register.

Meeting adjourned at 8:04 pm.
