

If you can't make it, or think you might not be able to make it, please email cameoquilters@gmail.com by 3pm, so we plan to set up ZOOM.


A Zoom link will be mailed out the afternoon of January 15th.


SPRING 2026 RETREAT




QUILTS OF VALOR 2026 NATIONAL BLOCK DRIVE

"Echoes" 2026 National Block 10" finished (10 ½" unfinished)



Welcome to Quilts of Valor's 2026 National Block Drive where your block donations support our efforts to cover every military veteran and active service member with a Quilt of Valor made especially for them.

When choosing fabrics for your block donations, please use the guidelines given below, this will insure we are easily able to work your donations into a quilt for a veteran.

Use only red, white (cream) and blue fabrics. Please DO NOT use floral fabrics. The center block is a great opportunity to incorporate those medium and large prints (including branch specific) that attract the eye. If choosing branch specific, represent only one military branch per block.

The reds and blues to the upper left and lower right corners of the blocks should read as solids, only very small prints will work here.

The whites and creams should also read as solids; prints larger than a pin dot are too overwhelming to the rest of the block.

Thank you for working with the 2026 block drive, I look forward to coordinating your donations of blocks to support our groups as they sew these blocks into quilts to honor our veterans. Sew happy you are a part of our team.



Echoes Block 10" finished block (10 1/2" unfinished)Block One

Center: 1-5 1/2" focus square (A)

Blue: 2-3" X 5 1/2" rectangles (B), 2-3" squares (C)


White: 2-3" squares (D), 2-3" X 5 1/2" rectangles (E)

Block Two

Center: 1-5 1/2" square (A)


Red: 2-3" X 5 1/2" rectangles (B), 2-3" squares (C)

White: 2-3" squares (D), 2-3" X 5 1/2" rectangles (E)




Sewing instructions are the same for Blocks 1, 2, and 3.



1. Sew one C to one D. Repeat for the other C and D.



2. Sew one B to one E. Repeat for the other B and E.




3. Sew units together as shown. Follow arrows for pressing.





Mailing Instructions:

1. If mailing ONE block, fold it carefully and mail in a standard business-size envelope with a "forever" stamp. It cannot be more than $\frac{1}{4}$ " thick.
2. If mailing more than ONE block, use a manila envelope (remove the metal clasp, as that makes it non-machineable and costs more) and take it to the post office to have postage attached.
3. If sending a lot of blocks, place them in a Ziplock bag and put a label with your name and address in the bag.
4. If you want to be notified that your quilt block donation has been received, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope with a note enclosed stating your block donation in your block package with your name, email address, and/or cell phone number.
