

Cuddle Blanket & Lovey



Blanket

3/4 yard cotton, flannel or gauze fabric

If using gauze, keep it folded in half for a double layer and stitch 3 or 4 lines down the length to hold the layers together. Trim to 25" x 30"

1 cuddle roll

Trim the cuddle fabric to 30" x 35" If you're using larger cuts of fabric and cuddle, Have the cuddle measure 5" larger than the fabric in both directions.

Lovey

1 cuddle square 20" x 20" 1 fat quarter trimmed to 16" x 16"



Draw a line on all 4 sides on the wrong side of the cuddle.


Blanket 2" from the edge

Lovey 1 1/2" from the edge


On each corner, place the
45 degree line of your ruler
along the edge of the fabric
with the edge of the ruler
at the intersection of the
two lines. Draw a line
edge to edge across
the corner.

One at a time, on each corner, fold the cuddle, right sides together, matching the ends of the diagonal line. Pin and sew across the diagonal line.

Trim 1/4" away from the stitch line. Turn the corners to the front, creating the mitered corners.



With the corners folded to the front, lay the cuddle on a flat surface. If the corners don't lay flat, you can sew the corner seam a little larger.



Place the fabric in the center of the cuddle, under the folded over edges. The center piece may not reach all the way to the folded edge. That's ok. Pin or spray baste the center fabric in place.

Additional quilting may be added to the center of the

project if desired.

Using a zig zag, serpentine, or decorative stitch, secure the cuddle to the front of the blanket by sewing along the edge of the cuddle.
