Community Service Project - AJ Bennett

I had a wonderful experience with a community project introduced by Lindsey at Holly Dee's. A lady came in to ask if they knew of anyone who could teach some kids how to sew. Lindsey brought her to me, and we talked. She was from the youth probation office in Lockhart. The kids had been sentenced to community service hours and wanted to learn how to sew dog blankets for the shelter in Luling. The quilt shop owner had given them 47 yards of cotton and flannel. We also supplied about 40 yards and in two sessions we made 40 blankets for the shelter. These kids were eager to learn and did a great job! There are a few wavy seams on the first blankets, but I don't think the dogs will mind! Unfortunately, because they are minors, I could not take any pictures. However, the lady in charge will try and take the finished blankets when I'm available so we can take pictures of the shelter receiving the blanket


