Unlocking Profile Drafts with Deb Essen





Understanding profile drafts is key for working with blocks in weaving. Deb Essen unlocks how to work with profiles with an introduction to creating a profile draft. She will then demonstrate how to convert a profile draft into a thread by thread draft. This will be a live presentation on Zoom with lots of time for questions and answers.

Deb Essen is the author of "Easy Weaving with Supplemental Warps: " (Interweave Press), is a frequent contributor for Handwoven magazine and has recorded several DVDs on Supplemental Warps, Pile Weaves with Supplemental Warps, Unlocking Profile Drafts, and Pin Loom Projects through Handwoven. She has been weaving for over 25 years and teaches at local, regional and national conferences, guilds and shops.
