## Diary of a Textile Archaeologist by Barbara Klessig



This presentation will take a look at the research that I have been accumulating for the past 30 years and include textiles, tools and iconography found in the sites, museums and storage facilities throughout Europe, Britian and the Mediterranean. Discussion and illustrations will look at the pre-Herstory (that's the way we textiles archaeologists spell it) and development/evolution of textiles and how we research and reconstruct those technologies of the past through experimental/experiential archaeology.

Barbara is a textile archaeologist and lecturer at Cal Poly Humboldt. She has been weaving and spinning for about 45 years and had an interest in ancient textiles and how they were made. She was 53 when she received her BA and 61 when she got am MA. She's been teaching at Cal Poly Humbolt now for 10 years and has been spending her summers in the field, excavating, monitoring and collecting data on textiles and the tools used in their creation. She's undertaking a PhD and will be looking at tools and their distribution from a site she worked on this last summer in Macedonia.

### New Opportunity!

My name is Stephanie Grant. I'm the coordinator for fiber alive, a youth outreach program. I briefly introduced myself at the September guild meeting. There is expressed interest from our youth about the fiber arts and our guild. We should seize the opportunity and meet them where they are, at their schools. I'm looking for guild members and friends to volunteer their time.

I've already spoken with heads of faculty at Ferndale High School, Eureka High School, Arcata High School and Redwood Prep Charter School in Fortuna. All of those schools have been forthcoming about their search for artisan creators to lead on campus enrichment programs both during and after school. They have all told me the fiber arts are perfect. The process will start with an assembly and classroom visits to perform basic demonstrations of knitting, weaving, spinning, dying and potentially more. With my initiative, not only can we bring additional members to the guild, but we can pass on some of the incredible skills possessed by members and keep fiber arts alive for the oncoming generations.
