




MEET CADENCE CLARK: GRANTS MAINSTREET'S NEW EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT

CURRENT PROJECTS

WAYFINDING

This past month, four revitalization specialists from New Mexico MainStreet visited Grants and spent the day inventorying current signage across the MainStreet district and the city. We also want to thank the volunteers who assisted the team—Les Gaines and Audrey Jacquez—for their time and support as they worked their way through town.

Next steps include compiling a full inventory of existing signs and wayfinding assets and producing a design portfolio that contains clear, prioritized recommendations for future wayfinding improvements. The portfolio will specify locations, sign types, visual standards, material/durability recommendations, installation details, and phased cost estimates — and will identify funding strategies to replace, add, and upgrade wayfinding throughout the MainStreet District and the City of Grants (grants, local budgets, TIF/main-street programs, sponsorships, and state tourism/capital improvement funds).

TREE RISK ASSESSMENT

We've completed the Tree Risk Assessment in collaboration with the NM MainStreet Revitalists and certified arborists to evaluate the health and safety of trees throughout the MainStreet District and Mesa Park. This initiative ensures a safer, more sustainable environment for residents and visitors by identifying potential hazards and supporting long-term tree management.

Next steps: We are applying for the Urban and Community Forestry Projects Grant, a federal funding opportunity administered through the U.S. Forest Service and the New Mexico Forestry Division. This grant supports projects that expand, preserve, and improve urban tree canopy through activities such as planting, maintenance, risk mitigation, and community engagement. Funding can also assist with planning, workforce development, and climate resilience efforts that

BUSINESS RECRUITMENT & EXPANSION PROJECT

We are actively working to recruit new businesses to the MainStreet district while also supporting the growth of existing ones. This project relies on data-driven strategies to identify service gaps and collaborate with entrepreneurs to fill them.

As part of this effort, we hosted our first Small Business Boot Camp on Tuesday, September 23rd, and are preparing to launch our first Peer-to-Peer Quarterly Networking Group. This networking group will bring together local entrepreneurs and business owners to share ideas, exchange feedback, and collaborate on strategies that strengthen our local economy. During these meetings, we'll also review data on retail leakage and small business opportunities to identify ways we can support one another, fill market gaps, and drive sustainable economic growth in our

BUILDING FAÇADE IMPROVEMENTS - NEW LIFE TO DOWNTOWN GRANTS

Downtown Grants continues to make visible progress as the Building Façade Improvement Project nears completion over the next few weeks. To date, Jenny's, Tim's Muffler, the Double Six Gallery, and the Community Outreach building have all received façade enhancements. The Hollywood Diner is wrapping up its final phase of roof painting, while Loeffler's will soon feature a new custom steel sign designed and built by the Skills Team at NMSU.

These improvements are transforming the look and feel of the MainStreet District, creating a more welcoming and vibrant environment for residents and visitors alike. Weather permitting, several additional façade projects will be completed in the coming weeks—continuing the positive momentum in downtown Grants.

PARK REVITALIZATION BRINGS NEW COLOR AND LIFE TO RIVERWALK PARK

Exciting changes are underway at Riverwalk Park, thanks to the creativity and dedication of local artists and community partners. A special thank-you goes to Nazario Sandoval, Audree Urioste, and Reanna Trujillo, our talented artists who have been working diligently near the fountain and throughout the park. Over the past several weeks, they have added beautiful artwork and vibrant color, creating a more welcoming and inspiring space for the community. Their work will continue over the next couple of weeks, bringing even more life to the park.

In addition to the new artwork, you may have noticed the light poles being repainted and revitalized—another step in our ongoing effort to refresh Riverwalk Park and make it a more enjoyable space for residents and visitors alike.
