



Hot Springs Village Lakes

With 11 recreational lakes, Hot Springs Village is a community of lakes surrounded by land. Amenities include three swimming beaches, two covered pavilions and two full-service marinas. The lakes offer a variety of fun activities like fishing, swimming, kayaking, boating and skiing.

The Hot Springs Village lakes are: Lake Balboa (944 acres), Lake Coronado (380 acres), Lake Cortez (245 acres), Lake Estrella (21 acres), Lake Granada (54 acres), Lake Isabella (25 acres), Lake Maria (27 acres), Lake Pineda (62 acres), Lake Segovia (11 acres), Lake Sophia (36 acres). http://hsvpoa.org/recreation/lakes/

Lake Ouachita

Lake Ouachita, the largest lake (40,100 acres) located entirely within Arkansas, is renowned for its scenic beauty and clear waters. Created when Blakely Mountain Dam impounded the waters of the Ouachita River near Hot Springs, the lake is virtually surrounded by the Ouachita National Forest and has one of Arkansas's most pristine shorelines at some 970 miles. The 40-mile-long lake is a favorite of sailors for its vast stretches of open water. Scuba divers enjoy the clear waters. Recreational boating, water skiing and other water sports are also very popular on Lake Ouachita, which boasts more than 100 uninhabited islands for primitive camping. Available rentals include houseboats, sailing crafts, fishing rigs and more. Contributing to make the lake one of Arkansas's finest outdoor destinations are Lake Ouachita State Park (with cabins), commercial marinas and resorts, and more than 400 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' campsites.

Lake Ouachita boasts an unusual feature, created by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. It is the Geo-Float Trail, a marked route that can be followed by boaters guided by a brochure that details prominent geologic features to be seen on the lake. Hot Springs, near the east end of the lake, is Arkansas's leading tourist destination and home to Hot Springs National Park and many other attractions. At the lake's western end, Mount Ida is famous for its rock shops and quartz crystal mines, many of which are open to the public for a fee.

The park has 93 campsites (58 Class AAA, 23 Class D, and 12 walk-in tent sites), some right on the water. There are eight fully-equipped cabins with kitchens and the comforts of home, most of them overlooking the lake. Four camper cabins are an affordable option and are right in the campground. They include one room sleeping for four, screened porch, picnic table with grill and lantern hanger, heat/ air. A family style bathhouse nearby (one large private room that has a shower, sink, and toilet) is perfect for families with small children. Bring your own linens, cooler and cooking supplies. They are dog-friendly. Other facilities include Caddo Bend trail, picnic tables, swimming areas, and a marina with boat and kayak rentals, bait, and supplies. Historic Three Sisters' Springs is in the park. There are also exhibits and a gift shop inside the visitor center. Interpretive programs such as guided hikes, eagle cruises, and kayak tours are offered year-round. The state park is near Hot Springs and Hot Springs Village.

Springs Village. An Arkansas fishing license is required for all HSV lakes. The lakes in Hot Springs Village are stocked with bass, catfish, bluegill and sunfish by the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission. The fish population is monitored by Game and Fish biologists and additional stockings are done if needed. In addition to the Hot Springs Village POA's specific regulations, all U.S. and Arkansas fishing and boating regulations apply to HSV lakes. HSV Temporary Usage Tag or an Annual Boat Decal from the POA or one of the marinas is required for all boating. Call 501-922-5556 for more information.

Arkansas's largest lake, Lake Ouachita offers 40,000 acres of clear, clean water surrounded by the scenic Ouachita National Forest. Swimming, skiing, scuba diving, boating, kayaking, and fishing are enjoyed here. Bream, crappie, catfish, striped bass, and largemouth bass can be caught in open waters or quiet coves. Choose from a wide variety of day-use areas and overnight accommodations. Contributing to make the lake one of Arkansas's finest

Bassmaster Magazine selected this lake as one of the country's Top 100 Bass Lakes (May 2012). For anglers, Lake Ouachita is well-known for its prolific fishing opportunities, especially for striped bass and largemouth bass fishing. It consistently ranks in the top 10 nationally for largemouth bass fishing. Mark Davis, 1995 B.A.S.S. Angler of the Year, spends a great deal of time on the lake. Fishing guides are available. Ouachita's acres are at normal pool level, with a crooked, rugged shoreline and an abundance of islands, especially in the lower (east) end of the lake. There are also many shallow areas that provide excellent feeding and holding places for bass, with deep-water escape just a few fin strokes away. Bass fishermen do well around these islands and shallow areas using surface lures, spinnerbaits, crankbaits, jigs and plastic worms. Deep, crystal-clear, with a floor of rocks, trees and other cover, and plenty of baitfish, Ouachita is ideal for big stripers. One of the most popular methods for catching

them is trolling with downriggers along the river channel from near the dam to where it is joined by the Little Blakely and Big Blakely creek channels. In May, many stripers also congregate in the upper end of the lake, especially in the area around the Ark. 27 bridge

This easy-going trail takes hikers along the shore of Lake Balboa and through the nearby forest. Benches placed behind the embankment make for great resting spots and provide an amazing view of the lake.



Coronado Boat Ramp Trail





This trail has a rocky and uneven terrain and one path goes up a hill, making this trail difficult. The hill can be avoided by going along a different, but longer, path.

Start/End: DeSoto Parkway Ln Length: .77 Miles Average Time: 20 Minutes Parking (P): POA Facility

DeSoto Trail

Start/End: Calella Rd Bridge Length: 3.4 Miles Average Time: 2.5 Hours Parking (2): Trail Head

This multipurpose trail is mostly paved, allowing for bikeriding and golf cart access. DeSoto Trail is relatively flat with some up- and downhill terrain.



Hernando Trail



Start/End: Promesa Ln/ DeSoto Beach Length: 8.6 Miles Average Time: 4 Hours Parking (E): Trail Heads

This trail is the longest in the village. With its length and hilly terrain, it proves to be quite difficult. The entire trail is next to housing, so there's not much wildlife.




Herradura Trail

This trail is flat and made of gravel. The wildlife of this one-way trail consists of birds and reptiles, as it's off the bank of Cedar Creek.








This beautiful, mulitpurpose trail has a moderate rating. It provides access to the DeSoto Golf Course and allows for bike and golf cart riding.







How Clampits Came to Be

Hard work and faith in God helped Joey and Lynn Clampit get through cancer, start a life together and open Clampit's County Kitchen. They are giving back to the community that has welcomed them with open arms.

Joey's career love is the meat industry but started his career as a counselor. One day in 2002, he noticed a lump on the side of his neck and saw a doctor who happened to be a friend. She gave him antibiotics and sent him home. The lump got bigger so Joey made a trip to Pine Bluff for a needle biopsy. Joey was a big, strong guy in his early 30s, healthy with no history of cancer other than an uncle who had skin cancer.

The test came back inconclusive. The doctor agreed to see him in his office after hours, as Joey didn't have health insurance. After a couple of hours of digging around under local anesthesia, Joey had enough. He was admitted to Jefferson Regional Medical Center, where a good tissue sample was obtained. A week later this tissue sample showed different results. Joey was referred to UAMS, where he had the tumor removed from his neck. It was diagnosed as non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, stage 2. He drove himself for his chemo treatments every other week for a few months and then radiation five times a week for a month. He was working the night shift so that he could get treatments during the day and care for family. Joey had lost his father, stepmother and sister in a car accident a few years prior and was helping care for his grandmother, who had dementia, during this time.

The treatments would knock Joey down for a day or two but he would rebound. He had a hard time eating and swallowing but is thankful most of the feeling came back. His medical care was more than \$125,000 and he lost his house. He moved to Hot Springs, where he had grown up, and got back into the meat industry. Joey was active in his church and loved motorcycling. His life changed again as he was heading home from church and was hit broadside by deer and knocked off his motorcycle. He had to learn how to walk again and take care of himself. Soon after, he met Lynn, who became his wife.

Lynn loved life and her family. On Dec. 25, 2000, Lynn was 34 years old when she found a lump in her breast. Since she worked in the medical field, she was able to get a mammogram and ultrasound and was told the lump was nothing to worry about.



However, a needle biopsy a few months later confirmed that it was a solid mass. Lynn had surgery to remove the tumor on April 6, 2001, and when she woke up, was told she had cancer and had a partial mastectomy. Her cancer, invasive DCIS (ductal carcinoma in-situ) another procedure was done to remove the sentinel and five surrounding lymph nodes. This day was the day of her grandmother's funeral. Since Lynn was so young and had a 5-year-old daughter, she opted for the strongest chemo therapy, knowing that she would never be able to get pregnant again. After her port was put in, Lynn started chemo treatments.

Each treatment began with an antinausea medicine but she still struggled with severe nausea. Lynn's mother came to help care for her and her daughter for the first week after her chemo. Lynn worked between chemo rounds throughout her treatment.

Due to the buildup of toxins from the chemo in her body, Lynn became very ill after her third round of chemo and she was hospitalized for the fourth round. She then started eight weeks of radiation, which she completed in October 2001.

Lynn's hair had begun to grow back, she was starting to eat and getting back her sense of smell when, during a followup with her oncologist in November 2001, her doctor found a spot on her back that looked suspicious. The spot, along with several others, was biopsied and the result, Melanoma. The tumor was removed and the pathology report showed margins to be free of cancer and no further treatment was necessary.

In January 2002, Lynn had an ovarian cyst, the size of a grapefruit, removed from her right ovary. Good news, no cancer this time.

Lynn's mother was diagnosed with breast cancer while Lynn was receiving radiation therapy for her breast cancer. Several years later, Lynn's mother was diagnosed with lung and brain cancer so Lynn left her job to care for her mother.

She moved her mother back to Arkansas so she could be close to her sisters and she soon began hospice care to help keep her comfortable. Lynn found a job in Hot Springs, where she met Joey. Joey proposed to Lynn at her mother's bed before her mother died on June 10. Joey and Lynn were married on Sept. 15, 2013.

Lynn didn't dwell on her cancer but reiterated that is was a blessing to care for her mother and that God sent Joey to be in her life. Joey said, "Be good stewards of blessings received." God has blessed them and their business and they are adamant about giving back to the community that has blessed them.

They both believe in supporting cancer research as the money helps develop new therapies and alternatives such as immunology treatment.

Fountain Lake School District

Supporting Every Student Every Day For Success



Fountain Lake Schools are located in Garland County in the south central region of Arkansas, more specifically in the Ouachita River Valley. The district encompasses 188 square miles of mountainous terrain.

The Fountain Lake School District is not located in the incorporated town of Fountain Lake, but acts as the focal point of a widely dispersed population. The district can best be characterized as semi-rural. The major industries of the district are forestry natural spring water bottling, crystal mining, and tourism. Approximately 2/3 of the 25,000 acres in Hot Springs Village lie within the Fountain Lake School District borders.

All of the Fountain Lake School District operations are located on one campus located on Highway 5 & 7 North, five miles to the north of Hot Springs, Arkansas. The enrollment of the

district is 1414, with 545 students enrolled in Pre-Kindergarten through 4th grade, 411 Middle School students in grades 5 through 8, and 458 students in grade 9 through 12.

Arkansas' United States Representative Bruce Westerman is among notable Fountain Lake graduates. Westerman began crafting his leadership skills in the hallways and playing fields of

Fountain Lake as a student, and later, as President of the district's Board of Education, before serving in the Arkansas LegÍslature, and now representing Arkansas in Washington D.C.

The Fountain Lake School District has as its vision: "The Fountain Lake School District joins with our community to inspire, motivate, and prepare every student to be a confident, productive, knowledgeable, goaloriented citizen."

The growth and development of Hot Springs Village has been mirrored within the Fountain LakeSchool District. For the past thirty years, Hot Springs Village residents and the Fountain Lake School District have endured growing pains, but have enjoyed a relationship that has improved the educational opportunities for Fountain Lake's students. Throughout the years, Hot Springs Village residents have served on the Fountain Lake Board of Education, working to help to drive the progress of the district.

Additionally, Hot Springs Village residents have tutored, mentored, provided educational opportunities and experiences to Fountain Lake students. A long-standing example of Hot Springs Villager's commitment to the students can be seen in the relationship between the Great Hot Springs Village Kiwanis Club and the Fountain Lake Charter High School Key Club. For more than twentyfive years, the Kiwanis have sponsored hundreds of students as Key Club members, promoting leadership through service to others. For years, a highlight of the interaction was the Ice Cream Social, held in conjunction with a concert at the Woodlands.

Fountain Lake Elementary School starts students on their academic career. The district funds two pre-school classes, bringing fouryear-olds on campus as the youngest "Cobras". After following the progress of students enrolled in Fountain Lake preschool classes in the early-2000's, the Board of Education chose to fully-fund the pre-school opportunity to give students a jump-start to education. That jump-start mindset continues throughout the elementary experience as students visit college campuses to get an early taste of college life. Teachers in the elementary utilize



Classroom Dojo has a communication and behavior monitoring tool to provide parents real-time feedback on the student's day and classroom activities in the form of text messages and notifications on the Dojo app.

Alongside the core instruction of reading, writing, mathematics, and science, elementary students enjoy exposure to music, art, and physical education. To encourage positive peer interaction and to grow interpersonal skills, in 2018, Fountain Lake Elementary adopted the "Choose Love" curriculum that focuses on becoming a force for good in one's life. In today's culture of conflict, "Choosing Love" has proven to be a valuable course of study and behavior for the students.

Fountain Lake Elementary students have the opportunity to extend the school day by an additional two hours in the afternoon by participating in the F.A.C.E.S. (Faculty and Community Enriching Students). This program is a joint venture with The Paul Bewie Boys' & Girls' Club, Walnut Valley Baptist Church, Living Hope Worship Center, and the Fountain Lake community, to offer free academic and enrichment activities for elementary students. The primary purpose of the 21st CCLC program is to establish learning centers that operate during non-school hours. It is designed to assist students in meeting state and local academic achievements standards in core academic subjects. Fountain Lake's after school program has been very successful in meeting these goals. The first hour of F.A.C.E.S. is dedicated to academic enrichment with homework help, extra practice, and small group instruction. The second hour features an activity program ranging from arts and crafts, horseback riding, swimming lessons at the HSV Natatorium, woodworking with the Village Woodworkers, jewelry making, and Nifty Nutrition. Each student has the opportunity to select a different activity each quarter.

Fountain Middle School Gobra Digital Prep Academy operates as a distríct conversion charter school through an agreement with the Arkansas Department of Education. This agreement allows the district to "do school differently". As the first public conversion charter school in Garland County, the Cobra Digital Prep Academy was established upon four supporting pillars to its approach to education: Character Education, Career Exploration, Project Based Learning, and Personalized Success Plans. Serving the 5th through 8th grade population of the district, the Digital Prep Academy begins each day with an advisory period, during which a small group of students are assigned a staff advisor. Advisory groups are maintained throughout the four years in the building. Students and staff work together during



that time to build a team and to establish an adult-student bond for supporting the student. During advisory and throughout the day, Stephen Covey's "Leader in Me" program is integrated to drive the character pillar of the charter and to aid students in developing and practicing the "soft skills" for which today's employers are searching. Interpersonal communication, the ability to work together, and thinking "Win-Win" are among the skills practiced in the middle school building.

Beginning in 5th grade, students explore a range of careers through career speakers, as well as through project classes. The project classes allow students to dabble in a variety of careers. If a student has an interest in the medicalfield, architecture, or robotics, teachers within the school have participated in extensive training to facilitate learning



experiences in those areas. Envision a roomful of 10- and 11-year-olds wielding scalpels on lamb's brains or using industry-grade software and equipment to digitally reproduce a building. Music production, public service, digital photography, and broadcasting are also opportunities to which students are exposed as they rotate through the experience class each quarter or semester.

The Personalized Success Plan (PSP) serves as a digital portfolio of a student's performance and accomplishments and as a guide book for the pathway upon whích a student intends to travel. While not carved in stone-the pathway can, and does, change often-the PSP provides

often-the PSP provides students with a centralized location to assemble the record of the journey. Student-led Conferences allow students the opportunity to share a recap of their journey with parents.

Increased student engagement and improved academic achievement encouraged the Arkansas Department of Education to renew the Digital Prep Academy's charter for an additional five vears.

Fountain Lake Charter High School, in its fourth year as a conversion charter high school, continues to assist each student on his/her individual quest toward the next step. Regardless of what the future holds for a Fountain Lake High School student, a pathway has been created within the school to facilitate that journey. On- and off-campus career-focused programs provide "real-world" experiences. Concurrent enrollment college courses assist students in building a college transcript before high school graduation. Extra-curricular and co-curricular activities and organizations further add to students' options for being a contributing member of a community and for building skills and developing talents and tenacity to see a commitment through to completion.

In cooperation with National Park College, many Fountain Lake students spend a portion of their junior and senior years taking classes in a high school program of study that eventually leads to industry certification and/or further higher educational studies. Medical Professional Education, Criminal Justice, Graphic Design, and Auto Mechanics are among the programs in which students participate. Family and Consumer Science, Agricultural Education, and Introduction to Teaching are options for students to complete on campus. Many of these programs lead students to enroll in the school's Internship program, which awards high school credit for workplace experience.

Students may enroll in pre-Advanced Placement and Advanced Placement courses in the core content areas--math, science, English, social studies--and in music theory and art. Concurrent enrollment courses that garner dual high school and college credit include College Algebra, College Composition I and II, and Spanish.

The Fountain Lake Cobra Marching and Concert Band and the Cobra Choir are awardwinning programs that allow students to grow and develop their musical skills. The Fine Arts Department annually stages a Broadway





musical. The Music Man, Grease, and Hello Dolly!are among the many productions performed in the past.

Student athletes compete in Arkansas Activities Association-sanctioned events in Football, Volleyball, Girls' Basketball, Boys' Basketball, Golf, Tennis, Baseball, Softball, Cheer, and Track. Fountain Lake sponsors PeeWee athletics in football and basketball for 3rd-6th grade students as well. Students also serve as team managers, trainers, statisticians, and broadcasting team members.

A wide array of clubs and activities are available to Fountain Lake students. Senior Beta and Junior Beta Clubs, National Honor Society, Key Club, Builders Club,



Student Lighthouse Team, Quiz Bowl, Future Community and Career Leaders of America, Future Farmers of America, and student-generated clubs for almost every area of interest are all options to augment the students' experience.

Fountain Lake boasts a caring committed staff. From bus drivers, custodians, and secretaries, to paraprofessionals, nurses, counselors, teachers, and administrators, each day finds the staff striving to meet the social and emotional needs of each student. After those needs are addressed, each student is challenge to do his or her best, to achieve more, to be more than he or she was the day before. While not a huge district, Fountain Lake attempts to find a way to meet the interests, needs, and dreams of each student, to live out its mission of supporting every student, every day.



Important County Tax Information:

Personal Property and Real Estate must be assessed each year before May 31 (without penalty). Taxes are due to be paid by October 10 of the following year.

You can find your local assessor by calling 501-324-9240.

Arkansas homeowners may receive up to a \$300 property tax credit on their homesteads. Eligibility for the credit is confined to a homeowners' principle place of residence. Nursing home or retirement center residents who own a home are also eligible for the credit, as are people who have deeded their homes to others while retaining a right to live in it (a life estate). Contact your local assessor's office for details.

In certain cases, disabled veterans are exempt from all state taxes on real and personal property. This tax exemption also is available to widow or widowers who do not remarry. More information is available from the Arkansas Department of Veterans Affairs Website, or by calling: 501-370-3820.

Tax Help Available:

AARP Foundation Tax-Aide offers free, individualized tax preparation for low- to moderate-income taxpayers -especially those 50 and older. This service is available to everyone, regardless of age or income. They do not need to be an AARP member to take advantage of this program. AARP and the Internal Revenue Service sponsor this program, which provides confidential income tax preparation, and e-filing for both federal and state returns.

All returns are prepared by trained, IRS-certified AARP Tax-Aide volunteers based on the 2017 tax law.

The AARP Tax-Aide service at the Garland County Library, 1427 Malvern, will be open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 3-7 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday Feb. 1 through April 17.

Additional AARP Tax-Aide site in Garland County: CHI St. Vincent McAuley Senior Center, 5010 Highway 7 north, Hot Springs Village, 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. When visiting an AARP Tax-Aide site, people need to bring:

• Picture ID of them and their spouse (if filing a joint return).

• Original Social Security card (or original Social Security statement) for everyone listed on the tax return.

• Income related documents: 1099s, W-2s, SS statements, brokerage statements, income such as selfemployment and any other information related to income. • Expense-related documents: taxes paid, mortgage interest, property taxes, medical, charity and any other information related to expenses.

• A copy of last year's tax return.

• For direct deposit of refund, a check or documentation of bank routing and account number printed by the banking institution.

Volunteers will begin preparing returns that have a 1099B (sale of stocks, bonds, mutual funds) after March 5. Program volunteers will not prepare returns of other states other than Arkansas. The exception to this is if there is a small amount of royalty from another state. The tax software provided by the IRS will not allow the volunteers to prepare a complete and accurate other-state tax returns. All customers are helped on a first-come, first-served basis.

Voting Information Voter Registration:

Voters may register to vote at the County Seat (Hot Springs for Garland County; Benton for Saline County).

Voters may also register to vote at local drivers' license offices while renewing their drivers' license. The drivers license clerk enters into the computer whether the driver would like to register to vote. The data is transmitted to the resident's county clerk. It is checked, verified, and a confirmation is mailed to the driver.

Registration is normally valid for four years; however, the registration is automatically renewed each time an individual votes. Thus voting at least once in a four-year period will assure continued automatic renewal.



Stray or Found Pets: These pets are admitted to Animal Control or rescued through other community sources and may be someone's lost pets. Their photos are posted on the **HSV** Police Department Facebook page, so please contact Animal Control if you may be the owner or have information that may help reunite a pet with its owner: 922-6547. Stray or found cats and dogs should be reported directly by a resident to POA Animal Control at 922-6547, not by someone else with second-hand information. If an animal needs to be trapped, Animal Control must obtain the homeowners' permission to set a trap on their property. AWL strongly recommends that those concerned about pets roaming on or near their

property, first try to see whether the pet belongs to a neighbor before calling Animal Control.

The DeSoto Dog Park is a gated, off-leash park for well-behaved and healthy dogs. The site is approximately 1.5 acres of level open area and divided into two sections for use by large and small dogs. The park contains benches, watering stations, waste receptacles and shade pavilions. By entering the park, you agree to abide by the posted rules. All users of this park do so at their own risk and are responsible for any situation caused by their dogs. To use the dog park, you must first register at the Property Owners' Association Administration building by signing a waiver and paying a small registration fee per dog. After registration,



residents will access the park using their community card; guests will be issued a gate card good for this amenity only. Open dawn to dusk. Located off DeSoto Park Lane.

Hot Springs Village Rules for Pets:

Pets shall be under owner control at all times, so as not to be a nuisance or hazard to others. No owner of, custodian of, or person of authority or control of any dog shall allow, permit or authorize that dog to run at large within the boundaries of Hot Springs Village.

Pets must be registered at the POA Administration office. Hot Springs Village is located in West Central Arkansas in the Ouachita Mountains. We're located 15 minutes from Hot Springs and an hour from Little Rock, the capital of Arkansas. There are two manned gates and five card-access only gates. The directions below are for the two manned gates.

GETTING HERE FROM LITTLE ROCK

Take Interstate 30 West to Exit 117. Take Highway 5 at Benton towards Hot Springs Village. Follow Highway 5 approximately 18 miles and arrive at the East Gate entrance to Hot Springs Village just past the community of Owensville. Turn right onto DeSoto Boulevard. The entrance gate is approximately 1/4 mile up DeSoto Boulevard.

The Highway 5 East Gate is manned from 6:00 a.m. – 12:00


a.m. each day. Access between 12:00 – 6:00 a.m. is through gate proximity cards. Visitors and property owners without proximity cards must use the Highway 7 West Gate after hours.

GETTING HERE FROM HOT SPRINGS

Follow Highway 7 North. Where Highway 7 and Highway 5 meet, turn left onto Highway 7 North. Follow Highway 7 North approximately 8 miles to the West Gate entrance to Hot Springs Village. Turn right onto DeSoto Boulevard. The entrance gate is approximately 1/8 mile down DeSoto Boulevard.

The Highway 7 West Gate is manned 24 hours a day.

There are five additional entrance gates to Hot Springs Village. They are not manned however, and require a proximity card to access. Many online and GPS mapping systems will use these gates as access points for Hot Springs Village. Please use caution. Only those directions which take you through the Highway 5 East Gate or the Highway 7 West Gate provide entrance to property owners and visitors without proximity cards.



ommunity Hot Springs Village Gate Access

Hot Springs Village has two manned access gates. The remaining five gates are accessed through electronic card readers or proximity card readers. The West Gate is located on Highway 7 North and is manned 24-hours per day by Public Relations Officers. The East Gate is located on Highway 5 and is manned from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. After 12:00 a.m., the gate can be accessed with a proximity gate card purchased from the Property Owners' Association. The same proximity card allows access through the Balboa, Balearic/Danville, Cortez and Glazier Peau gates.

Property owners who live near the DeSoto/Goosepond gate must purchase a special electronic key card from the Department of Public Safety to use this construction entrance gate. Members may now authorize visitors to enter the East or West manned gates by entering information directly into system. There is no longer any need to call gates prior to guests' arrival.

Members may add guests to visitor log anytime up to ten days prior to arrival. As both gates share information, only one entry is required.

To report visitors, please sign on to the Member Login and complete the gate access form. A member portal users guide and first time login instructions are located at the top of the HSVPOA home page.




2018 Hats Off Event
