
#### 2021 Dental & Wellness Clinics

Code Ann. 6-18-1906 and the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) Rules Governing The Public School Choice Act of 2015. To apply for this transfer, call your school of choice. Applications must be submitted no later than May 1st to begin in the fall semester.


