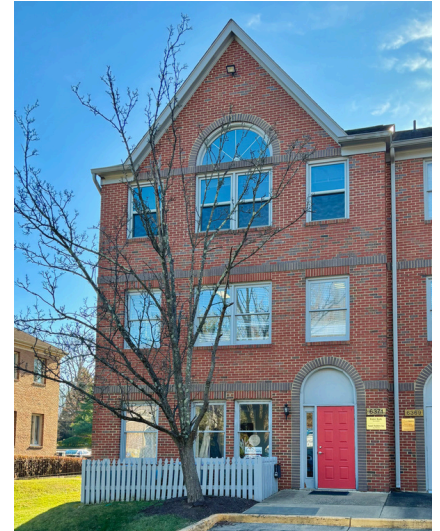

## 2025 Housing Predictions

- The National Association of REALTORS®'s Chief Economist Lawrence Yun predicted interest rates will hover near 6 percent for 2025. "That will be the new normal," he told a convention session in November 2024.
- Bright MLS predicts "Bigger metros will likely see faster increases in sales activity in 2025, as more companies call workers back to the office and proximity to employment centers becomes more important," and they don't predict home prices to fall anywhere in the Mid-Atlantic market.
- Realtor.com reports: "The unemployment rate is expected to remain low, registering just above 4%, helping push household income higher. The anticipated gain of 3.4% will just surpass inflation, helping to give the typical household a bit of welcome breathing room on their monthly budget. However, incomes don't quite keep pace with home price gains. Nevertheless, the boost in buying power from moderating mortgage rates means that affordability improves modestly."

On December 11, 2024, the Fairfax County Planning Commission voted 9-0 to recommend approving to the Board of Supervisors the rezoning application for The Canopy Reston. The proposed land has already been approved for an assisted living and memory care building with up to 130 total units, but construction has not commenced. This new application would allow for independent living units to be added to the plan as well. # Cookie of the Quarter



## Classic Snowball Cookies

### Ingredients:

- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar (plus extra for coating)
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup finely chopped nuts (walnuts or pecans work well)

### Instructions

- Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- Cream the butter and sugar: In a large bowl, beat softened butter and powdered sugar until light and fluffy.
- Add vanilla: Mix in the vanilla extract until combined.
- Incorporate dry ingredients: Gradually add flour and salt, mixing until just combined.
- Fold in nuts: Gently stir in the finely chopped nuts.
- Shape into balls: Roll dough into 1-inch balls and place them on the prepared baking sheet.
- Bake: Bake for 10-12 minutes, or until the bottoms are lightly golden. Do not overbake.
- Cool slightly: Let cookies cool for about 5 minutes, just enough to handle them.
- Coat in powdered sugar: While still warm, roll cookies in powdered sugar until evenly coated.
- Cool and re-coat: Once completely cool, roll in powdered sugar again for a snowy finish.

Enjoy these melt-in-your-mouth holiday treats! Perfect with a cup of coffee or hot cocoa.

Extra tip: Add in pink, red, or green sprinkles to the dough before baking to customize for Valentine's Day or St. Patrick's Day!
