Through these activities, we witnessed language development, fine motor and gross motor growth, cognitive advancement, and meaningful social-emotional development within our California facilities.

I am also delighted to share that we have expanded our outreach into Texas to further support youth and families, expanding our mission beyond the State of California. In early August, Highschool Youth leaders in Texas proposed to the Board of Directors a youth-led action plan titled Growing Together in Awareness of Our Differences for a Common Unity and Veterans Memorial in Military City U.S.A. in San Antonio, Texas. This youth-led initiative allowed highschool students to tap into their leadership skills and polish upon their communication, social and communal awareness while navigating obstacles and challenges they faced in their local undeserved and at-risk communities. Overall, this initiative was a success and TIAF Youth Leadership team received community service hours, in their resumes and letters of recommendation for their college-applications.



All year long, TIAF made it a priority to give back to our community and to the families who have reached out to us for support and come through our facilities. Whether it's been assistance with groceries, clothing, supplies or our annual Christmas blessing, and other essential resources, TIAF shows up with the utmost love and a genuine eagerness to uplift the infants, children, youth and families we serve. Last Christmas 2024, TIAF honored the fifth anniversary of my grandmother Isabel's passing and the legacy she left with us. Mission and Vision



The Vision of The Isabel Amaya Foundation is to create comprehensive after-school care, child care, and educational support, fostering a nurturing environment for holistic development.



On 9/11/25, the youth (ages 5-25) of The Isabel Amaya Foundation held a day of Growing Together in Awareness of Our Differences for a Common Unity via a cross-cultural study group through educational books and peer-to-peer tutoring for their holistic development. Keeping in mind the targeted population of local students and newly arrived immigrants and refugees in San Antonio, Texas to learn about one another and foster community.

Youth paid tribute to those who lost their lives on 9/11 including their families, and those who rose in service of response by writing thank you cards and creating unique art pieces that pay respect and remembrance to first responders. Thank you cards were submitted to a local Veterans Association center.


Hi,


