Greetings All,

September was a month, like many, with highs and lows. In the first couple of weeks of the month, we said so long to a dear, wonderful person, Jackie Platt. I only got to meet Jackie a few times, but each time I did, I could feel the Holy Spirit's presence. Even now, while I'm typing this note, remembering Jackie, I can feel the Holy Spirit's presence. Let us all hold on to her memories and continue to do our best to live as Jackie lived; loving and celebrating God through a life well lived and focused on God. Jackie is missed, but her memories will live on in our hearts as we continue to celebrate God together. Please keep Jackie's family in your thoughts and prayers. On a lighter note, it finally happened! As of Sunday, September 30, 2018, I am the official pastor of New Hope Parish. It has been a long but pleasant journey getting here. One with many blessings, evidence of God's presence in each step of the way. I'd like to say a heart-felt thank you to the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), Kathie Pinneo, Grady Atwater, Pat Fox, Shari Latto and Mike Barnett. Each of them was so helpful, with God's guidance, in helping to make all this a reality. And, as I have said before, and can't say enough, thank you to each of the congregations for helping to make my family and me feel at home.

I know that each church family of the New Hope Parish has gone through some troubling times in the recent past, resulting in sisters and brothers leaving the church family. As a new pastor, I feel called to share with you a recent conversation I had with God. I caught myself looking at the empty pews and worrying about filling them up. I was actually feeling some anxiety about it. My mind raced with things to do to get people in the pews. It was beginning to be a distraction. I prayed about what to do, but really didn't take time to listen for God's still speaking voice and sought to fix the "problem". Albert Einstein once defined insanity as, "Doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results." I realized that, because I wasn't pausing to listen to God's still speaking voice, and trying to solve the "problem" myself that my anxiety remained and the pews remained empty. So, I took a deep breath and told myself to be quiet, and then I listened. What I heard was God telling me not to worry about the empty pews, worry about the pews with people in them. They are here to receive the Gospel, God's Good News. If I focus on sharing the Gospel with a sincere heart, guided by God, then the people will be fed and God will take care of bringing more lost sheep back to the fold. In short, when I realized that God needed to be in control and not me, I realized there really was, and is, no problem. We must have faith in our faith and leave God in control. Remember Jesus' words from Matthew 6:27 & 33-34, "Who among you by worrying can add a single moment to your life? ... Instead, desire first and foremost God's kingdom and God's righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore, stop worrying about tomorrow, because tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

As I continue to get settled in as your pastor and you get settled in as having me as your pastor, please do not hesitate to share with me, any thoughts or suggestions on how we can better serve the communities of New Hope Parish.

As we look forward to the future, let us look forward through the eyes of Jesus, with eyes wide open and hearts full of hope and a confidence that God is in control. We should be excited about each day that we've been given. And don't hide that excitement, share it! The gifts God has given us are not to be hidden but to be shared. "Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a basket. Instead, they put it on top of a lampstand, and it shines on all who are in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before people, so they can see the good things you do and praise your Father who is in heaven." (Matt 5:16-16 CEB)

Remember, God is good all the time! Amen!
