Devotional Pause

At the beginning of a new year when life can feel both hopeful and overwhelming, breathe deeply and rest for a few moments in a time apart with God.

Listen

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in the territory of Judea during the rule of King Herod, magi came from the east to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We've seen his star in the east, and we've come to honor him." When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and everyone in Jerusalem was troubled with him. He gathered all the chief priests and the legal experts and asked them where the Christ was to be born. They said, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for this is what the prophet wrote: You, Bethlehem, land of Judah, by no means are you least among the rulers of Judah, because from you will come one who governs, who will shepherd my people Israel."

Matthew 2:1-6

Think

On many church calendars, January 6th is an important day. You might know it as the 12th day of Christmas, when the caroler sings of a gift of twelve drummers drumming (and now you've got that song stuck in your head once again!). For churches that follow a schedule of seasons during the year (often called a liturgical calendar), January 6th is the Feast of the Epiphany. The reading we have for our reflection is one that often comes for this festival day, when we hear about the appearance of the star that leads the magi in their search for Jesus.

If you look up the meaning of the word "epiphany," you'll see that it's like someone having an "ah-ha!" moment when everything becomes clear. I like to think of the magi, and even King Herod in this passage, having their own "ah-ha" of what God was really up to in coming to earth to be with us in the person of Jesus.

Question to Ponder: What are epiphany or "ah-ha!" moments you have had about God?

God of brilliant light and presence, thank you for loving me so much to want to come and be with this world in the flesh and blood of Jesus. Help me to be surprised and amazed at the ways you show up before me today and throughout this season. Amen.
