The Guest Speaker for the very first Daytime Chapter meeting was our Patron, Mr Syd Monkhouse speaking about "The appreciation of orchids and growing them in the home environment."

Both Syd and his wife, Shirley were with us today which was great. Syd thanked everyone for their support and said how pleased he was to see that the Daytime Chapter was still functioning well.

All previous convenors who were able were invited to join us for lunch. Cold meats, dessert and cake were supplied by the Club and members brought along a salad or a cake to share. This all worked out perfectly well with a great selection of salads and everyone commenting on how good they were.

Mrs Jane Higgs joined the Club in 1992 and was joint convenor with Lesley Fenton in 1994. She gave a short talk on the running of the Daytime Chapter in the past. This was most interesting. Not much has changed, it still seems to work.

We had two guest speakers today, Mr Colin Campbell, one of our resident judges and Mr Ralph Lucas. Colin and Anne's trip to Singapore and Amsterdam, was the focus of Colin's Power Point presentation. This showed us a lovely selection of orchids around Singapore, all so vividly coloured and well displayed. Then the gardens in Holland all with hundreds of tulips. The OAM was awarded to Ralph in 1998 for service to Floral Societies. He is a Life Member of the Rose, Chrysanthemum, Gladioli and Enfield Societies. He has been a member of these societies for 50 years and a member of the Camellia Society for 40 years. He was the Show Secretary of all five Clubs for at least 20 years and Judge for all five Societies for many years.

Ralph was treasurer for the Rose Trial Garden for 8 years (up to 3 years ago) exhibited roses at most country shows and also Melbourne and Perth. He won the Sunday Mail Garden Competition twice, once in 1959 and again in 1969. He was awarded two top rose awards in the 1990s and received a certificate from the Botanic Gardens. Ralph was also auditor for many floral societies. He hybridised gladioli. He showed us a photo of this, a beautiful pink flower, with many flowers along the stem. Ralph was also a judge at the Royal Adelaide Show for daffodils and other cut flowers.

This is quite a list of accomplishments, so many hearty congratulations for a job well done. You must surely be and rightly so, very proud of what you have achieved. Thank you Ralph, it was really nice to see all the lovely medals.

Ralph won our popular vote segment today with a lovely plant of a softcane dendrobium "Nobile", a lovely plant with many lovely blooms. Congratulations Ralph, there's just no stopping this man. Isn't it wonderful to see such dedication.

### Meeting Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> October 2011

With the arrival of spring weather we have seen an influx of visitors to Victor Harbor and a renewal of activity along the Fleurieu generally. Our Group has been active during the colder months with established members continuing their propagation and successful growing of many fine blooms. We also had the pleasure of welcoming new members.

#### **Beginners' Class**

This class was well attended and President Geoff once again shared his wealth of knowledge and experience on growing and care of cymbidiums and other orchids.

His hints included not to leave orchid flowers for too long on the plant, rather pick them and enjoy their beauty in vases indoors. He also explained that regular trimming off the bottom of the stems will help the flowers last longer in water. The main plants could then be placed in the shade house or under deciduous trees for the warmer season.

He advised not to leave the plants in full sun on hot days and only water daily in very hot weather and suggested every second or third day at other times.

We also discussed fertilizers and potting up needs while members queries were answered in good humour.

#### **Meeting opened 2.0pm.**

President Geoff opened the meeting and thanked John Gay for presiding over last month's meeting. He welcomed all, including new members Veronica Walsh and Alan Pavey (who received gifts of Orchid plants) and Guest Speaker Leslie Gunn and her husband Bob.

## October Plant Commentary

**Flower of First Division and Flower of the Night:** *Dockrillia linguiformis* var *Nugentii* was benched by Rod & Judy McRedmond. The plant was mounted on a slab of treefern; well grown and flowered with many typical linguiformis type flowers, very fresh and clean. There were some 37 inflorescences each carry an average of 23 flowers. The flowers were approximately 27mm wide by 25 mm high, creamy white in colour with a spotted labellum. An excellent specimen plant and credit to the grower for the culture exhibited. Well done Rod & Judy, you are growing your orchids exceptionally well. There were 30 plants benched in First Division on the night.



**Flower of Second Division:** *Dockrillia linguiformis* was benched by one of our newer members Craig Harkness. The plant was mounted on a piece of virgin cork; well grown and flowered with many typical linguiformis type flowers, very fresh and clean. There were some 20 inflorescences each carry an average of 17 flowers. The flowers were approximately 25mm wide by 23 mm high creamy white in colour with a spotted labellum. An excellent specimen plant and credit to the grower for the culture exhibited. Well done Craig, keep up the good work. There were 18 plants benched in Second Division on the night.



**Flower of Open Division:** *Laelia Cattleya* Tropical Pointer 'Galaxy' was benched by John & Bev Gay this plant was very well grown and carried three inflorescences 1x5 flowers and a bud, 1x4 flowers and the third had 4 buds. The flowers were very clean and fresh, pinky orange in colour with darker purple spots on the petals and sepals, with a bold burgundy barred labellum yellow in the back of the throat highlighted with a creamy pink pollen cap. Another well grown Laeliinea plant from the Gay's stable. We could all benefit by talking to John to find out how he grows these plants. Keep up the good work John & Bev. There were 33 plants benched on the night.

## SPRING SHOW

In the absence of our regular Registrar Ian Attenborough, Colin Campbell and I managed to get the job done but unfortunately forgot some of the finer points, like a write up about the Judging and a summary of the champions of our Spring Show.

There were approximately 150 plants across the Divisions and a good variety of genera was on display. I am going to try to fill in some of the details for those members who were unable to attend or view the display at Arndale Shopping Centre.

The Grand Champion, Open Division and Champion Oncidiinae grown by Peter & Geraldine Flavel was *Macdellanara* Pagan Lovesong 'Ruby Charles' an outstanding flowering of the clone with 19 large flowers on an upright inflorescence at least one metre in length. The flowers were green in colour with dark brown blotchy markings on the petals and sepals with the large creamy labellum.

Peter & Geraldine also grew the Champion Any Other Genus with an outstanding plant of *Ludisia discolor*.

Lucy & Geoff Spear owned the Australian Native Champion and Champion Species plant. It was a very well grown specimen plant of *Dockrillia striolata* 'Leedham' growing on and almost covering a 25mm thick cut down house brick. The flowers were many and typical for the species; creamy yellow upside down flowers. This plant was also the nomination for the Bill Murdock & Les Nesbitt Trophy. The Judging Panel also looked at this plant for a Club Cultural Award. The result being an Award of Cultural commendation with 78.3 points was given.

Geoff & Lucy also grew the under 60mm & the 60 – 90 mm Cymbidiums. *Cym.* Ruby Brook 'Falling Fire' had a black red flower of good shape on pendulous inflorescences and *Cym.* Sims Vision 'Barcelona' had upright inflorescences with a pastel pink, round, filled in flower of excellent shape. This plant also won the Roy Hill Trophy for the Best Intermediate *Cymbidium*.

John & Bev Gay grew the over 90mm *Cymbidium* Valley Splash 'Sue Ellen' which is not as well known as "Awesome" but equally as pretty. A good shaped large, round, filled in flower, petals and sepals are creamy white with blush overlay.

The Champion Laeliinae, grown by Richard & Beryl Wilson, had one inflorescence carrying 4 very large pristine white flowers with a yellow labellum from memory.

Helmut & Ursula Herrmann grew the Champion *Paphiopedilum* Sussex Pearl and the Champion *Phalaenopsis* which was unfortunately an unknown.

The Plant of *Cymbidium* Dry Devon grown by Henk & Erna Van Leuveren was Champion Specimen and the Elsie Chisholm Trophy for the best novelty *Cymbidium*. It had approximately 12 pendulous inflorescences carrying 12 to 14 miniature open shaped creamy white flowers with magenta spots & dots on the petals and sepals and the unmistakable *Cym. devonianum* labellum.

The First Division Champion was *Dendrobium* Tyabb 'Young Splendour', a very nice colourful plant with numerous inflorescences each carrying approximately 10-12 flowers grown by Malcolm Young. This plant was also the best Australian Native Hybrid and a nomination for the Ira Butler and Reg Shooter Trophy.

Kevin Trevan produced another one of the very good *Zygopetalum* from his stable. *Zygopetalum* Clare Fisher 'Zenía'. This plant carried typical flowers for the type but of very good shape.

The Champion Seedling grown by Rod & Judy McRedmond was *Cymbidium* (Red Beauty x Valley Regent), a plant that has very good potential with an upright inflorescence carrying 10 round filled in flowers of good shape. I look forward to seeing this plant once it matures over the next couple of years.

## **SPRING SHOW (cont.)**

The PC Loke Trophy for the most floriferous Australian Native was won by Ron & Irene Parish with a well grown and flowered plant of *Dendrobium X gracillimum*. The flowers were creamy yellow, typical for the type and too many to count.

Second Division Champion was a very well grown plant of *Coelogyne Intermedia* owned by Trevor Stutley. The pendulous inflorescences carried 7-8 flowers each in pristine condition. This plant is a primary hybrid *Coel (cristata x tomentosa)* which was first registered way back in 1913.

I would like to take this belated opportunity to congratulate all the winners and more importantly thank all the members taking part in the Spring Show as I believe the biggest thrill is to participate in the event. The winning is a bonus.

## **The Guest Speaker for November**

Our guest Speaker for the November Meeting is Kevin Hipkins of Peats Ridge NSW. Kevin has been involved with orchids since he was aged 12 and has been actively involved in nurseries for some 45 years, the last 25 years as Royale at Peats Ridge. During this time he has accrued a vast amount of knowledge and has seen many changes with orchids. The nursery was a cut flower producer in the early days but now supplies the hobbyist and the "Pot Plant Trade". Kevin has also been recognised as a hybridist of note having a quality "gene pool" at his fingertips to enable him to create some very different new hybrids that are in demand because of the fact that they are different to what we have become accustomed to in past years.
