Preble residents, as neighbors of Tully, Otisco, or Lafayette, you may have heard about Palmer Capital's proposal to construct at least 25 massive wind turbines, each reaching 680 feet into the sky. Whether you're already informed or just hearing about it, it's essential for everyone to understand how this project could affect our lives and the environment.

That's where Southern Hills Wind Watch (SHWW) steps in. We are a bipartisan grassroots organization, working together to protect your safety but also the delicate ecosystems that make our region unique. This isn't just about scenic views—it's about safeguarding our waters, the headwaters that feed into vital waterways, the unstable geology of our southern hills, and the endangered species that call this area home. The turbines also pose risks to critical bird migration routes that have existed for centuries.

We're actively engaging with elected officials, collaborating with environmental groups, and keeping

a close eye on the decision-makers to ensure our voices are heard. Our goal is to have Palmer Corporation withdraw from this project; such industrial turbines do not belong in neighborhoods or on unstable hillsides.
