#### <u>NSUPA's Annual</u> <u>Blair Morrow Paver of the Year Award</u>

At the NSUPA Seminar in April 2019, Aberdeen Paving Limited (Crew Foreman – Brian MacIsaac) were presented with the 2018 Blair Morrow Paver of the Year Award. This was the second win for Brian's Crew as they previously won the award in 2016. They are the first repeat winner since the awards inception. The award is presented at the NSUPA Seminar every April to an asphalt crew in the province based on a point scoring system. Crews are evaluated on factors including knowledge, planning, workmanship, communication and overall quality of paving. 
