Methodology & Demography

Methodology

Interviews were conducted August 18 through August 21, 2024 by live telephone operators, including landlines (15%) and cell phones (85%). Interviews include 1,000 Likely Voters (LVs) across Pennsylvania, Michigan, and Wisconsin, with an oversample of 200 Likely Florida Voters. Quotas on age, gender, ethnicity, education, region, and party where applicable (PA & FL) were used to ensure a representative distribution. The study's margin of error is $\pm 3\%$. The oversample's margin of error is $\pm 7\%$.

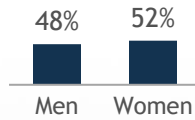

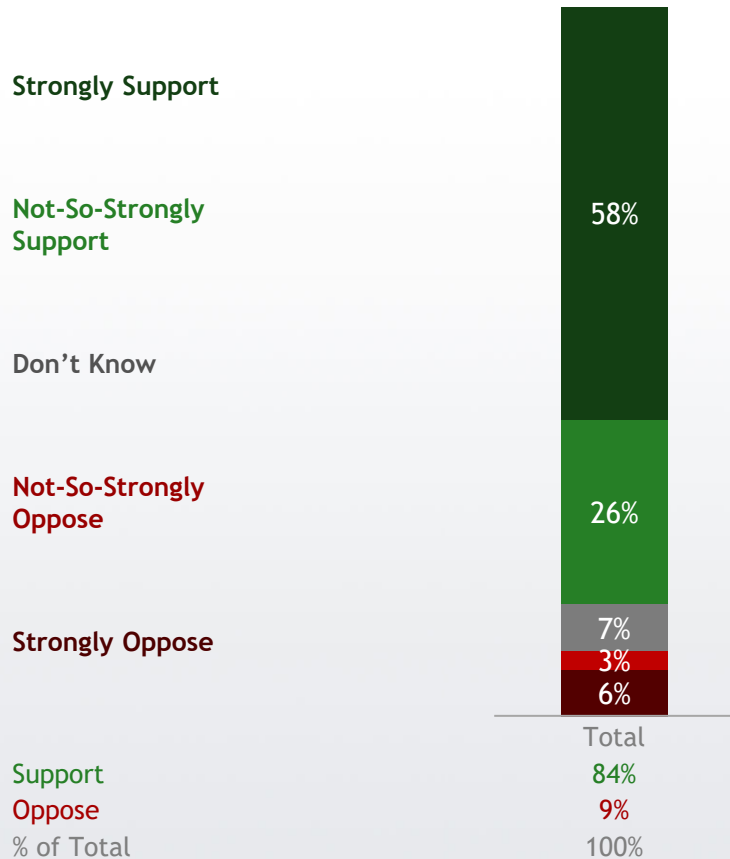

Cannabis Support

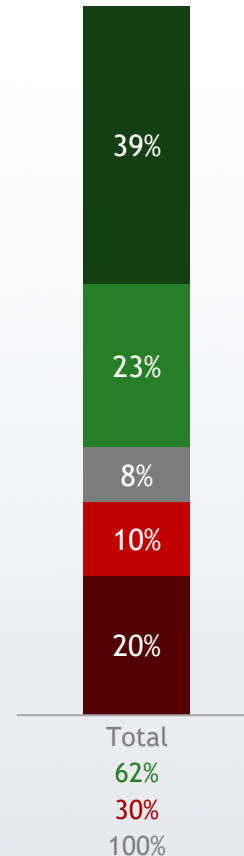
An overwhelming majority of voters (84%) are in support of Medical Marijuana, and a significant majority (56%) support legalizing small amounts for Americans over 21.

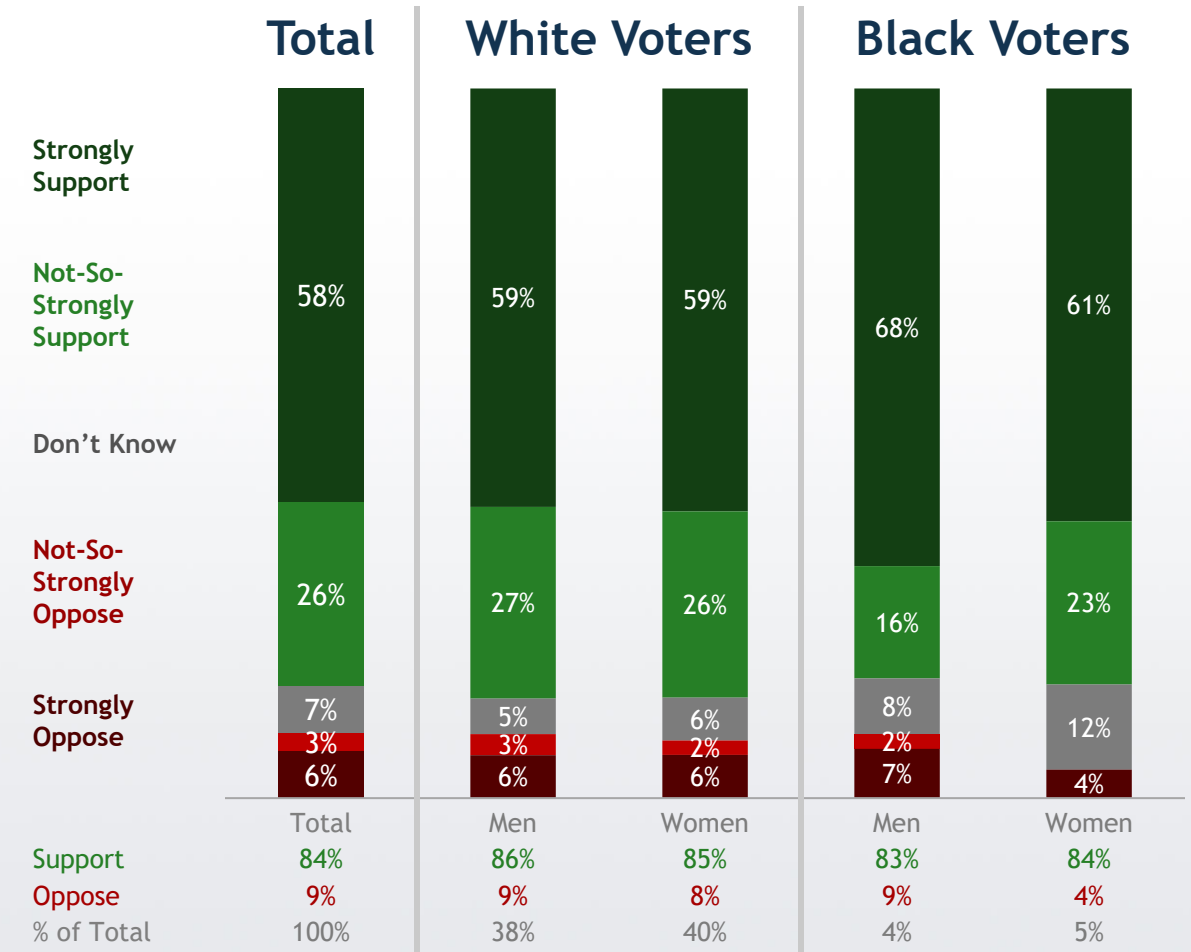

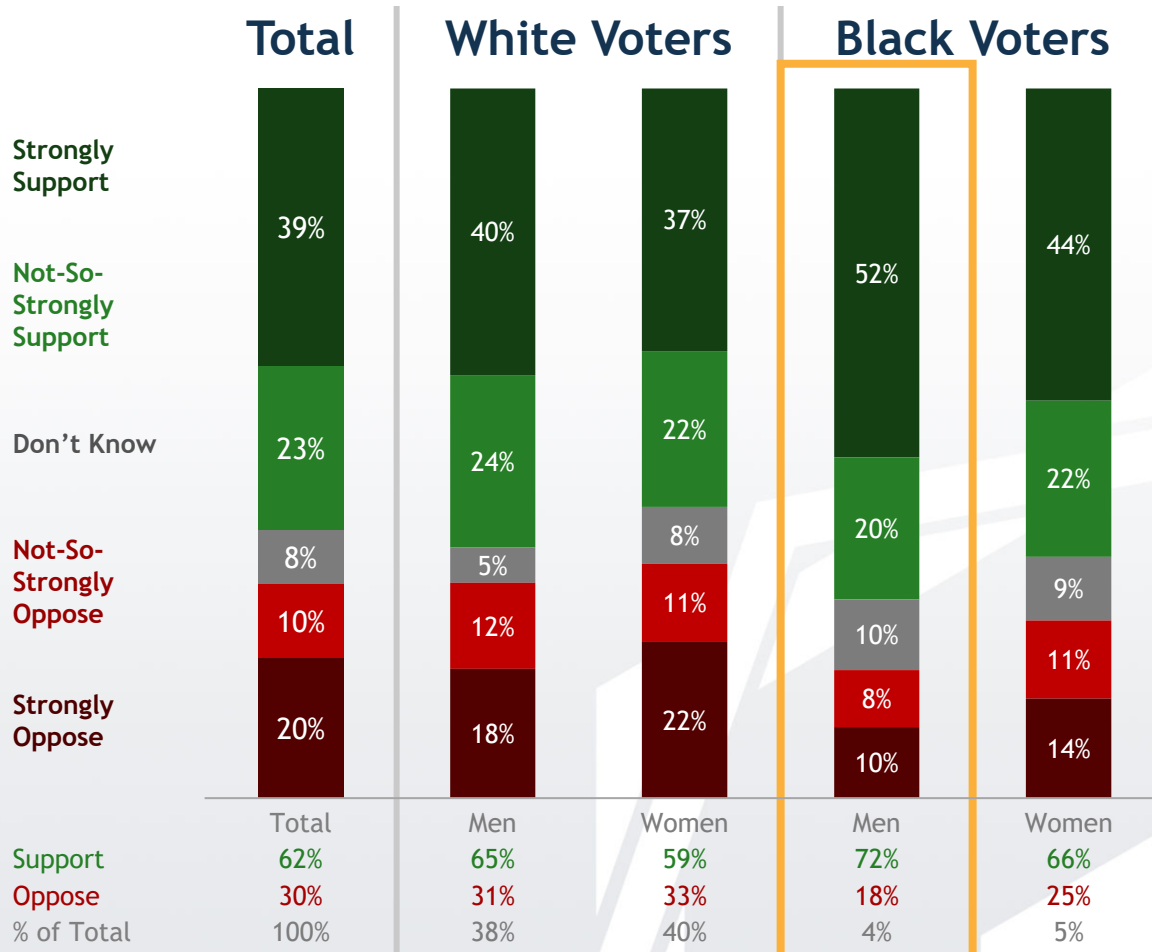
Legalize for 21+

Support/Oppose Legalize Medical Breakout

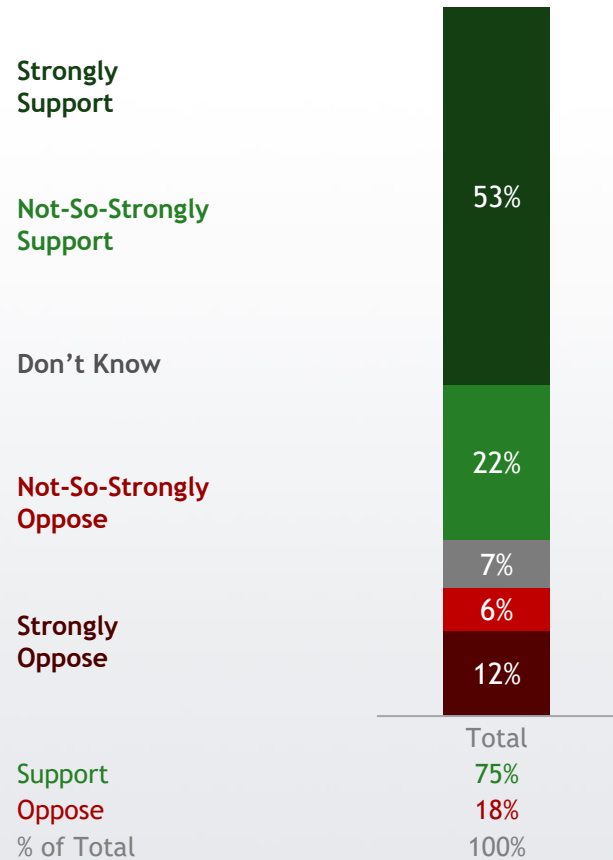

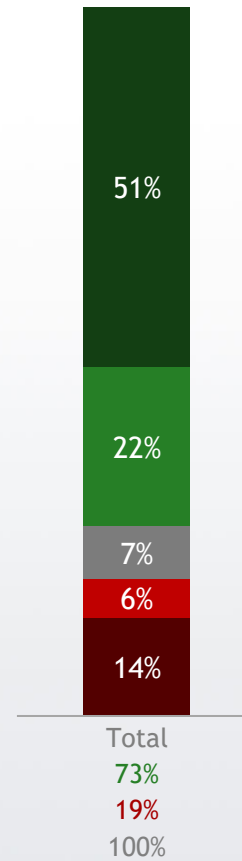
Already strong majority support is increased as Americans learn more about the impact of legalization.

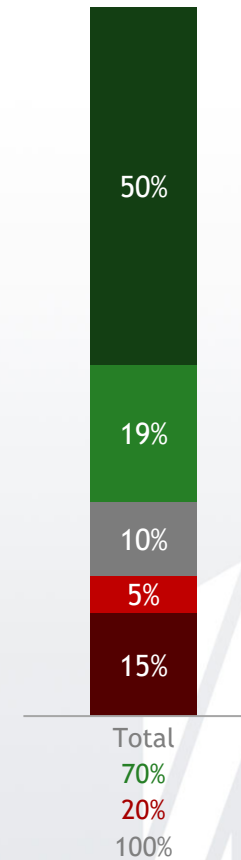

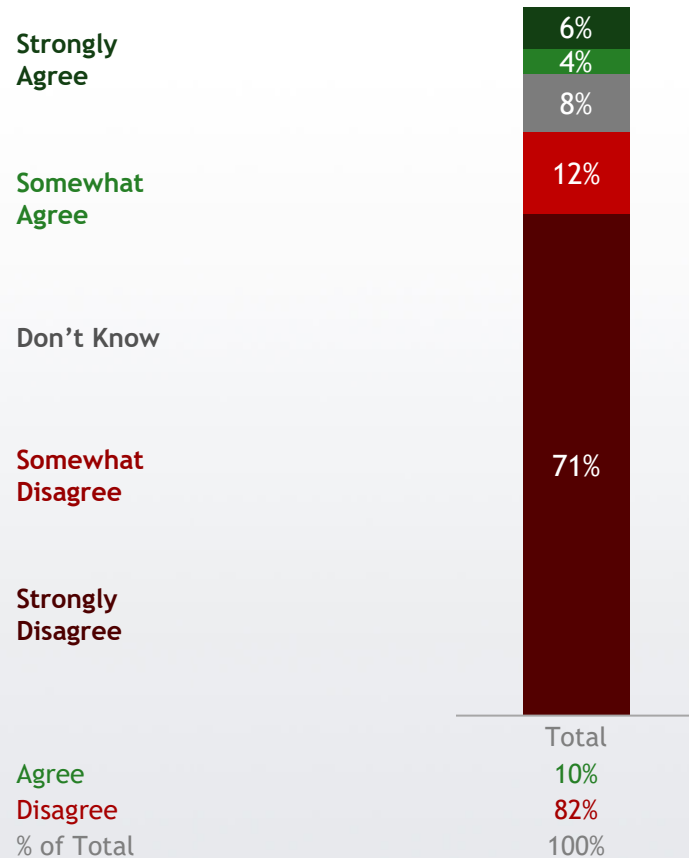

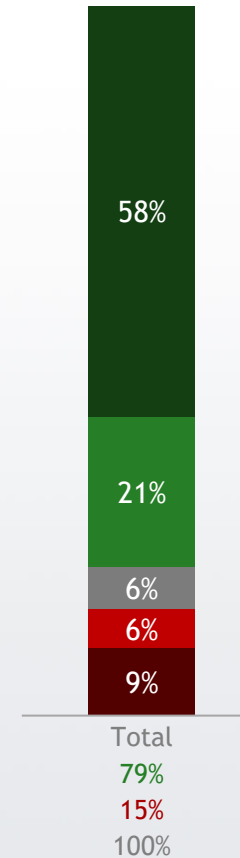

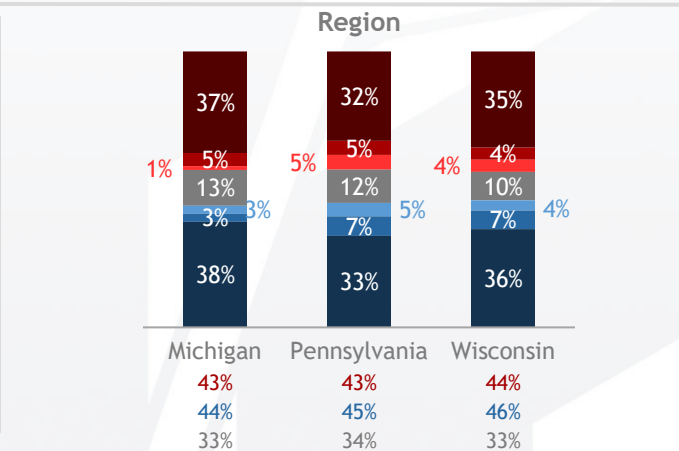
