

Methodology

Ragnar Research conducted a poll of 400 Likely Republican Primary Voters (RPVs) across North Carolina's 6th Congressional District. Interviews were conducted December 18th through December 20th, 2023 by live telephone operators, including landlines (18%) and cell phones (82%). Quotas on age, gender, and region were used to ensure a representative distribution. The study's margin of error is ±4%.

The Political Environment


The race for North Carolina's 6th Congressional District is competitive though Mark Walker has the initial advantage. Currently Walker leads in both total name ID as well as favorability (49% ID and 29% Favorable) Meanwhile every other candidate is unknown with name IDs below 50%.



Congressional Ballot

With three months to go until election day Walker is in a good, position. As of now there is no clear distinction between the candidates when it comes to ideological preference. This tracks with the lack of knowledge about each of the candidates. The field's low name ID and Favorability should allow Walker to run whatever kind of campaign he wants. The key is to become known in the entirety of the district.

The race remains far from over with 58% of voters' undecided and 82% being considered persuadable voters.



Question Text

Images: Now I am going to read you a list of names of people or groups of people. After I read each one, please tell me if you have a favorable or an unfavorable impression of that person or group. If I read you one you have never heard of, just tell me and we'll move on to the next one.

Full Ballot: If the Republican primary election for the U.S. House of Representatives were held today, would you vote for Mark Walker, Bo Hines, Mary Ann Contogiannis, Christian Castelli, Jay Wagner, or Addison McDowell?
