### Use At Own Risk

- Always test an item before you buy it or know the seller well enough to be able to return it if it's not.
- Expect to pay a premium: Additional cost on top of the melt value, which covers the manufacturing of the item, uniqueness, rarity, and the merchant's added value. Premiums are variable from item to item and seller to seller.

# Gold Markings and Stamps

- 24 karat, 999 = 99.9 %+ Gold
  - > 24k is considered Pure Gold
- > 22k, 916 = 91.67 % Gold
- 20k, 833 = 83.3% Gold
- ▶ 18k, 750 = 75.00 % Gold
- ▶ 14k, 585 = 58.33 % Gold
- ▶ 12k, 500 = 50.00 % Gold
- 10k, 416 = 41.67 % Gold
- 9k, 375 = 37.5% Gold
- 8k, 333 = 33.3% Gold

Karat / 24 = % Gold
Melt Value = % Gold \* Weight \* Spot Price
Expect to pay a premium

# Silver Markings and Stamps

- 9999, .9999 = 99.99% Fine Silver
- 999, .999 = 99.9% Fine Silver
- > 950, 958, Britannia Silver = 95% Silver
- > 947, 91 zolotnik Russian Silver
- > 925, 92.5, Ster, Sterling, Sterling Silver = at least 92.5% Silver
- 916, 88 zolotnik Russian Silver = 91.66%
- ▶ 900, COIN, Coin Silver = 90% Silver
- ▶ 875, 84 zolotnik Russian Silver = 87.5% Silver
- 850, 830, 825, 800 85%, 83%, 82.5%, 80% Silver = known as European Silver, or Continental Silver
- > 720, .720 = 72% Silver, also referred to as Coin Metal

**Melt Value** = % Purity \* Weight \* Spot Price Expect to pay a premium

# Gold and Silver The Imposters (A.K.A. Coin Ad Scam

tactics)

- 50 mils Gold/Silver Mils is a thickness referring to the thickness of the plating over a different metal
- Alpaca Silver No silver at all
- E.P. Electro Plated, only the surface layer is Gold/Silver
- ▶ German Silver If marked as, has no Silver at all 0%
- Gold/Silver Color item color is Gold/Silver, contains no Gold/Silver
- Gold/Silver Plated Plate Plated
- Layered with Gold/Silver same as plated
- Nickel Silver No silver at all
- Replica or Copy This means the item is a replica or a copy of the authentic coin. This does not mean the item is copied with the original item's real metal. "Copy" can be seen on real or fake Silver/Gold items. Testing is required.

\*Plated items – can still show tarnish

### Calculating The Dollar Value of U.S.A. Constitutional "Junk" Silver

#### 90% Silver Dollars

- Face value \* 0.7734= Silver weight in Troy Ounces
- •Ex. \$ 2.00 of 90% Silver Dollars
- •\$2 \* 0.7734 = 1.5468 Troy
  Ounces (ozt) of Silver
- 1.5468 \* spot price = melt value

#### 90% Silver Halves Quarters, Dimes

- •Face value \* 0.715 = Silver weight in Troy Ounces
- •Ex. \$ 2.00 of 90% Silver
- •\$2 \* 0.715 = 1.43 Troy Ounces (ozt) of Silver
- •1.43 ozt \* spot price = melt value

#### 40% Dollars / Halves

- Ike Dollars = 0.3162 ozt of Silver in each
- •Ex. 10 lke Dollars = 10 \* 0.3162 = 3.162 Troy Ounces of Silver
- Kennedy Halves =
   0.1479 ozt of Silver in each
- •Ex. 10 Kennedy Halves = 10 \* 0.1479 = 1.479 Troy Ounces of Silver

#### Face Value Multiples for 90%

- Multiple / .715 = Price per ozt
- •Ex. 25xFace Value
  - $\bullet$ 25/.715 = \$35 ozt
- This means you're buying into Silver at \$35/ozt
- You pay 25xFace
   Value of the coins
  - •Ex you pay \$25 for 4 90% quarters
- Premium is included in this multiple

#### Expect to pay a Premium

Additional cost on top of the melt value, which covers the manufacturing of the item, uniqueness, rarity, and the merchant's added value. Premiums are variable from item to item and seller to seller.

#### 90% Silver - Face Value - Reference Chart

You'll know when you need this.

Example: 4 quarters have a Face Value (FV) of \$1.00 \$1.00 of 90% Silver at 22xFV = 22x\$1.00 = \$22.00 charged to Customer at \$30.80 per ozt of Silver
