

Community Life

It has been another busy year in the community life ministry. We have four main committees up and running this year, including our newest media committee, which is working on improving our social media outreach, website offerings, and community engagement. The Saturday update and weekly pre-sermon meditation emails continue to be a blessing to our congregation, and I appreciate this team's efforts to keep us all connected and in the Spirit.

Our Wednesday night dinner team maintains dedicated volunteer support and feels strongly that breaking bread collectively brings us closer together in community. Our team plans meals, shops, preps, cooks, sets up, serves, and cleans up each week in the fall and spring. Many hands make light work. We continue to have 40 to 60 people gather weekly to eat and stay to participate in the evening events including Pastor Dan's adult programming, youth group, choir, and other small group activities. Special crossover events with CALC also take place on Wednesday nights, including the Annual Chili Cook-Off/Pumpkin Decorating Night, Advent Craft Night, and the Spring Pie Bake-Off.

A coffee team helps facilitate coffee and tea service on Sundays. The machines were recently reprogrammed to help us be more efficient, and once serviced, should be even easier for anyone to make coffee. Currently, one crew sets up hot/cold water and makes coffee, while the other team cleans up and puts it all away. I appreciate their willingness to learn our coffee machines and hospitality set up to be a resource for our church.

The community life committee started meeting last fall to help plan events and is currently working on spring events including a church picnic, ladies spring tea, CALC 30th anniversary celebration, supporting a VBS ministry, Easter/Palm Sunday, Mother's Day and Father's Day celebrations. I am praying for more people willing to envision additional ways to engage our congregation and encourage more connection throughout our regular and occasional visitors.

I appreciate every single one of you who volunteer to help in each of these areas, whether occasionally or every week. Your faithful commitment to each other is a testament to Christ's love and care radiating through you. It certainly takes a village to make so many things happen! I am grateful so many of our church family are able and willing to participate in serving each other. 
