These products are odourless other than for fragrance. Household bleach is used in the toilet. Identify surfaces that are frequently touched by many people (often common areas), e.g. door handles, shared equipment and workspace. All areas, tools and resources will be cleaned after each session. 	 A copy of our cleaning guidelines/routines are available to view on our website.
