Getting or spreading the coronavirus by a group gathering	 advise against coming to the studio if you fall into the vulnerable or shielding category as advised by the government. Each Visitor will enter the studio one by one and be directed to a designated seat and workstation. Two crafters per table with each crafter being 1+ meters apart side facing each other. Each crafter has their own work area. Three tables in a spaced line in the studio, side facing each other. Exception to the above points; Wreath making will be two large tables pushed together to form a square. 4 crafters will be situated at each corner of this square facing inwards with 1+ meters apart from each other. Our studio capacity has been cut from 12 down to 6 to accommodate the new guidelines and layout. As we are a retail and educational setting we can accommodate more than 6 people in our studio, 	 Once everyone is seated, a short safety briefing will take place by the tutor to set out expectations and set hygiene standards.
