Letter from the Pastors

The Advent of our God...

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down... - Isaiah 64:1

This month is a time of new beginnings in the church. We start over fresh with the lectionary, the planned set of readings for each Sunday. We have gone through the three year rotation and now we start the system all over again with Year A – the year of Matthew.

With that year of Matthew, it is the beginning of the new year for us. The previous year has ended and now we enter into the festival season. That means the start of Advent, and with it we enter into the newness of life in Jesus. When he enters into history, physically, born of a woman, born under the law, he enters into your time and into mine. He takes on the flesh we share. He lets himself take on time and space that he might save you and me from time and sin. That he might be born to die to lift you up from the grave to newness of life. A life centered on the One who continually comes for you.

We don't think about that part of the Gospel, do we? That the Gospel is not just about getting to heaven (whatever that means), the forgiveness of sins (yes, please!), or resurrection from the dead. It is a continued story of Jesus himself coming for you. Committing himself to you. Reaching out towards you. The Good News of Christ is not that a way has been made to climb up the mountain of God in hopes of reaching his throne room one day. It is that God has come down to you. He is done with waiting for you to put on your hiking boots and grab your walking stick. He has come down to you to bring you heaven itself – where death cannot defeat you; where sins no longer entangle you; where you are free to be his own.



There will be a bonfire, a cookie buffet, hot cocoa and cider to follow.







Keith, Jennifer and Andy



Keith grew up in Wisconsin, where he was raised Lutheran and Jennifer grew up in Kansas, where she was raised Catholic. They met and went to school together in Missouri. After graduation, Keith came to Ridgecrest to start work at the Naval Air Warfare Center in September of 2001, the day before the infamous attack on the World Trade Center and Pentagon. He is currently the Range Safety Officer.

Jennifer's degrees in civil engineering took her to work in the San Diego and Austin, TX areas, leading to a few years of long-distance relationship. They were eventually married on the beach in Coronado – Jennifer's uncle officiated the ceremony (he had also married her parents).

Keith's Apple Pie

Preheat oven to 450 degrees.

Cut apples and make sugar mix for filling first so its ready to go when you make the pie crust.

Crust Recipe DO NOT OVERHANDLE

Makes top & bottom crust w/ a little left over

1 cup flour ½ tsp. Salt 1/3 – ½ cup Crisco ½ cup ice water (ice cubes in cup, let sit)

- 1. Mix flour & salt in w/ fork
- 2. Mash in Crisco should look pebbly
- 3. Drizzle ice water in and mash it in (no ice cubes)
- 4. Sprinkle flour on counter
- Gently lift ball & very lightly knead (keep cold & manageable).

Filling

8 cups apples, sliced small (about 2 1/4 lbs)

3/8 cup sugar

3/8 cup brown sugar

2 Tbsp flour

1/8 tsp salt

2 tsp lemon juice

1/4 tsp nutmeg

2 tsp cinnamon

1 – 2 TBSP butter or margarine (can use up to 1 stick, more is better)

- Combine sugar, salt, lemon, nutmeg, and cinnamon
- Place ½ peeled, sliced apples (or unpeeled is ok) in pie crust
- Sprinkle ½ sugar mix over apples
- Pour in rest of apples, mount toward center, and cover with rest of sugar mix.
- Cover evenly with small pats of butter, lay top crust on and pinch edges.
- Cut holes in top.

Bake at 450 degrees for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 325 and bake for 45 minutes. Check for even bubbling, juice should be bubbling through crust.
