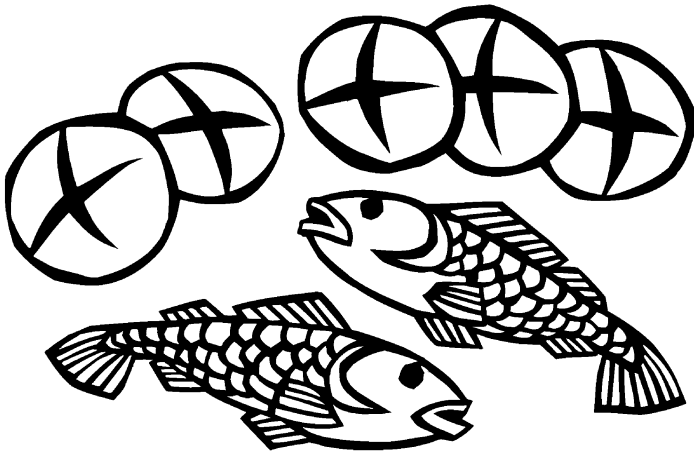


GRACE AT HOME

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

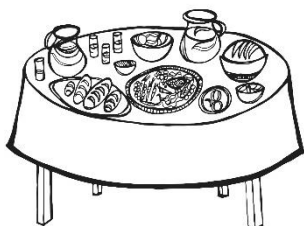
