Letter from Pastor Kris

When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy." Luke 1:41-44

May 31st is the Feast of the Visitation, a minor festival on the Church Calendar that remembers a pregnant Mary going to visit her relative Elizabeth who was, at that time, pregnant with John the Baptizer. I thought this gospel text and festival of the Church Year which celebrates motherhood would be good to lift up in this month in which we celebrate Mother's Day and of course Father's Day soon after.

The very first commandment God gives after the three commandments that deal with us and our relationship to God concerns the office of mother and father, "God has given this walk of life, fatherhood and motherhood, a special position of honor, higher than that of any other walk of life under it. Not only has (God) commanded us to love parents but to honor them. In regard to brothers, sisters, and neighbors in general he commands nothing higher than that we love them. But he distinguishes father and mother above all other persons on earth, and places them next to himself. For it is a much higher thing to honor than to love."* So we worship God only (Mtt.4:10), we honor our father and mother (Exodus 20:12), and we love our neighbors as ourselves (Leviticus 19:18).

There are no greater titles or offices under heaven than that of father and mother, for by them God has decided to preserve humankind and give each of us individually and specifically our lives. I love the naming of Eve in Genesis 3: in Genesis 2 Adam calls the partner God made for him "woman" because she was taken from his rib, but in Genesis 3 Adam so lovingly names this particular woman Eve because "she was the mother of all the living." That word mother, (Am) in Hebrew, is a word that relates to tender caring; even before Eve has born a child (as the narrative goes Cain and Abel aren't born until chapter 4), yet she has been promised a child, and with that promise Adam looks at

this woman in a whole other light; he looks at her now and sees the tender care of a loving mother. Created for Adam to make him complete, she herself is the sign of hope that his kind (humankind) will not begin and end with him. In Luther's Genesis commentary he observes that, though Adam was made good (Gen.1:31), there was one good that he lacked which all the other creatures had, hence God says, "It is not good that man/Adam should be alone..." (Gen.2:18). That good which Adam lacked was the hope of any future for his "kind." Eve is the fulfillment of Adam's goodness and his hope for a future.

The office and vocation of father and mother is nothing to be scorned or shied away from; in fact it is the first commandment given to humanity recorded in Scripture, "Be fruitful and multiply" (Gen.1:28). Furthermore, there is no greater work under heaven given to men and women than to parent children in the love and fear of God. Life is something to be greatly esteemed, to be held in highest regard. So it is a great work to "be fruitful and multiply," there is no greater work than to bring one's children up in true fear and love of God (in fact, it is the most needful thing in Christendom),** and there is no higher way to honor one's father and mother than stepping into these offices one's self whether one steps into this office by natural law (i.e., pregnancy and childbirth) or by civil law (i.e., adoption). So how great is the joy of a husband and wife as they become parents; how much greater the joy of grandparents to see their children become parents.

A blessed Mother's Day to all you moms and women who have taken on a motherly role to those in need of a good and honorable mother and an early blessed Father's Day to you fathers and men who have taken on a fatherly role to those in need of a good and honorable father. Sola Deo Gloria




