

Letter from the Pastors

Speech that frees...

Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. – Ephesians 4:29

I love the First Amendment. This should not come as a surprise to you. I'm a pastor, so you would have to assume that the ability to have free exercise of religion is important to me. Because I am a preacher, you can also assume that the free exercise of speech is also important to me.

However, as I just finished going through Paul's letter to the Ephesians, I am amazed by how often he speaks to us about not being "free" in our speech as Christians, but instead to speak words that free. We are to "bear (put up) with one another in love" (4:2) and "maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (4:3) Yes, we do point to Ephesians 4:15 when we get into our political and religious debates – "speaking the truth in love" – but it is often used as permission to basically be a jerk. We forget that the truth he is speaking of is the adamant statements he makes in the Gospel of being free in Jesus, forgiven in his blood, and because he has died and risen for you and me, we have been brought to peace with one another and with God.

It is no wonder, then, that we are to speak no evil, only good words for encouragement and building up, and especially words of grace. That we are to put away words of bitterness, wrath, anger, arguing, slander, and malice. (4:31) We are to be kind, tenderhearted, and forgiving as God has forgiven us. (4:32) In other words, the Gospel being on the tips of our tongues at all times. Maybe even thinking before we speak, "Did Christ die so I may say *this*?"

As a Disney adult, this is where you think I will break out the wise words of Thumper's mom, that Thumper parroted back in Bambi "If you can't say something nice, don't say nothing at all". It is true, but I'm not one for childish sayings or mottos. Instead, let's use our speech to free one another from sin, from fear, from the idols of politics and class that bind us. We should speak into the world speech that does not leave the sinner condemned or build up the walls of "us and them", but tears down every wall and points to the saving work of Christ. So when we interact online, have political conversations with our friends or family, I do wonder what would change if we were to read this verse over and over again, and then maybe ask ourselves, "What I am going to say now, is it to try to win a fight, or point to my Jesus?"

Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the June 17, 2025 GLC Council Meeting were approved with a correction of the Sunday services attendance count. The attendance count was corrected to approximately 110 for first and second services combined.

Consent Items

Consent items were approved after the following discussions:

- The ac in the music room is not working.
- We need to check on the manufacturer's warranty.
- We need to get estimates to fix the music room ac from other HVAC providers.
- Signage for the sanctuary was discussed. One of the bigger signs is almost done.
- The ice maker has been leaking in the Fellowship Hall kitchen. The water line has been replaced and that should take care of the problem.

Old Business

Sanctuary Refresh

- A contract has been signed to paint the sanctuary.
- The start date is several months out.
- We need to identify and schedule work that needs to be done before the painting can start.
- Continuing Resolutions will be addressed at the council retreat 10/10/25.

New Business

Check writing was discussed. It would be favorable to use direct debit for some charges.

- The church treasurer will look at the church's insurance and possibly shop for new insurance on the church buildings. The umbrella policy should remain as is.
- The utilities have risen considerably. The gas bill is higher. The Ground Water Authority caused an increase of \$300 monthly in the water bill.
- Our use of solar was discussed. Our solar was installed in 2018. A council member will investigate the advisability of adding more solar panels and a solar battery pack.
- Workman's compensation cost is going up.
- Pastor Kris will ask a knowledgeable church member to do some insurance shopping and check into workman's comp.
- The Handbell choir and Chancel choir will be starting up next month.
- The facility usage policy needs to be updated and possibly increase the cost of outside organizations using our facilities.
- Further discussion is/needs to be had on music room usage.


GLC Council Calendar





Spotlighting the Family of Grace The Hardy Family

Aaron, Christi, Micah, Nate, Ethan, and Caleb



Nate Hardy came to Ridgecrest in the spring of 2020 to head up the restoration of the Naval Air Warfare Station to its pre-earthquake functionality. Navy contracting and construction typically take about 10 years, but the work has proceeded at an amazingly fast pace with buildings being completed in under 5. Nate will be retiring from the Navy with 24 years of service soon and the civil service contracting office will certainly be looking to gain his expertise!

Nate's family soon followed him to the Mojave Desert, a very different environment after living in Washington State. Ridgecrest held another, smaller new environment for the Hardy family as well: after having always purchased older homes to fix up, they purchased a new home for the first time. It's nice not to have to work on it, but they do miss living in the character of an older home.

Christi went to work for Sierra Sands School District and is currently an eighth grade teacher at the new STEM school. Being a new school for all the students, teachers and faculty, there is much to learn for everyone!

They arrived here with only one teenager, but time flies and boys grow. Aaron is now in San Luis Obispo attending college. Ethan is studying in Paraguay this year. Caleb attends Burroughs High School. Micah attends the STEM school, which is convenient to have Christi and Micah at the same school.

Despite not coming from a Lutheran background, the Hardy family wanted to try a Lutheran Church, so it didn't take long for them to find Grace and they became members soon afterwards. They have blessed the congregation with musical skills: Nate plays trumpet and bells; Ethan played piano and percussion with the praise band; Micah played a special piano piece for service during the summer.

OVEN-BAKED SKILLET PANCAKE Serves 4 to 6

- 1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 Tablespoons granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 4 Tablespoons unsalted butter, divided
- 1 1/4 cups buttermilk
- 2 large eggs, separated
- 1 1/2 cups blueberries, plus more for serving
- Maple syrup, for serving



- Arrange a rack in the upper third of the oven. Place a 10 inch cast iron skillet or oven-safe nonstick pan in the oven and heat to 375 degrees F.
- Mix dry ingredients: whisk flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt together in a large bowl.
- Melt half the butter in small pan over low heat or microwave in a separate smaller bowl in 10 second bursts until melted.
- Add buttermilk to the melted butter. Separate 2 eggs, collecting the egg whites in the measuring cup used for the buttermilk. Add the egg yolks to the melted butter and whisk to combine.
- Combine the wet and dry ingredients. Pour the buttermilk mixture into the flour mixture and stir with spatula until most of the flour is moistened. Add the egg whites and fold in just until incorporated. Do not overmix!
- Set the batter aside for 10 minutes to rest it.
- Melt the other half of the butter in the preheated skillet by swirling the pan until the butter melts and coats the bottom and sides.
- Spread pancake batter evenly in pan, top with blueberries.
- Bake until puffed and golden brown, 25-30 minutes
- Serve with maple syrup and more blueberries. Enjoy!


