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Letter from Pastor Smee

Really Now

But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. – John 4:23

What I love about Jesus, and especially about the Gospel narratives, is that it always speaks to you and me today. Yes, it will speak of things in the past, as Jesus and the writers recount history. Yes, the focus of the whole of scripture is on that one day on a hill outside of Jerusalem 2000 years ago, where Jesus died for you. But, when Jesus speaks his parables, when he preaches his sermons, when he meets people like the woman at the well, he speaks to you.

Here, as Jesus is arguing with the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well, and is explaining to her the way of the kingdom, he opens up the present to her and to you. "The hour is coming and is now here." A particular time is spoken of as on the horizon, but then he blows it all up and says, "Actually, it is here." The word in the Greek is "now." Not yesterday, not tomorrow. Now. A particular thing that we are to be looking for is actually here. A time to do a thing.

What is this thing? It is a thing that is summed up by a word we love to love – worship. But it is not based on music, or liturgy, or even words. Worship, as used here, is the word for kneeling or prostrating oneself before a superior being. It is the honest understanding of who we are before God; not before your neighbor or pastor, but before the Lord. It is the physical manifestation of our dependance and our submission to him. We make it easy when it is shrunk down to songs or personal preference, but you know where I am going here, right? If the word is about loss of our personal preference, and instead is about the true realization that we are small and our God is not, how does that change our approach to church? How do we enter into worship, prayer, scripture reading, sermonizing, etc?

Jesus speaks of this worship being done in a certain way – a "true" way. The word for "true" in the Greek is the word for genuine. Being real. It's not done for show. It is not done out of obligation. It is done from a heart that has connected to the truth that God is God. That he is your God. It is bringing yourself before the Lord as the real you. Not who you want to be, or who you pretend to be, but the sinner/saint you are. Being a true worshipper is one who kneels before the Lord in all their brokenness and knowledge of their own sin. We often don't want to do this though, because we want to believe that what God wants is our piosity and religiosity; in other words, the figure we cut as a "good" Christian, because we don't believe that the Lord is gracious and merciful, abounding in steadfast love, even though it is his actual name revealed to Moses in Exodus 34. We can't imagine that he could love the real us, with real sins, real pasts, real trauma, and pain.

But I tell you that you are wrong. He is gracious. He is merciful. He is loving and he is intentional. He is not a God who waits for you to get things right, or to make him happy. No. Instead, as we walk our way though Advent this year, we are reminded that he is a God who comes down to us. He is a God who is the initiator of all that is love and salvation. He is a God who came to you before you ever came to him, and he does not do it in glory and lightning and thundering mountain tops. He does it as a baby. A baby that is small and weak. He does it this way because he wants to bring us to himself in our smallness and weakness. He doesn't look for us to be champions and great image-bearers of virtue and good works. He looks for us as sinners to save, as sheep of his own flock to lead, as children to take hold of to keep us close.

So this Advent, come to the Lord now, not later, as the genuine you. As the real you. Kneel before the Lord, our God, our Maker, and know that he will not be a fearful God of punishment and anger, but one of love and mercy.






