

Letter from Pastor Smee

The Lord's

But now hear, O Jacob my servant, Israel whom I have chosen! Thus says the Lord who made you, who formed you in the womb and will help you:...I will pour my spirit upon your descendants and my blessing on your offspring....This one will say, "I am the Lord's"; another will be called by the name of Jacob; yet another will write on the hand, "The Lord's," and adopt the name of Israel. — Isaiah 44:1-5

May is over and June has begun. In just over 11 weeks we will be sending our youngest off to college, and we hope we have done our job. As parents we always beg that we somehow did it right. At least most of us do, I think. We hope that they have learned the survival skills necessary to adult for an extended period of time. (As I am writing this my oldest is texting me as she and her boyfriend try to figure out how to change a flat tire for the first time.) And yet, we can only do what we can do. There is no ideal parenting or process that punches out a well-mannered, well-formed adult. We are not factories and assembly lines, but human beings with faults and feelings, and we get things right sometimes, and we may get things terribly wrong.

This goes with our spiritual life as well. Spiritual parenting is even harder than actual parenting because most of us rebel at our parents' beliefs, not embrace them. We want to make things our own and grab ahold of things that work for us. But on that journey, difficulties come. We wander off on our own. We forget God, which is a human's favorite pass time. We get left often alone, jettisoned off into this life, somehow thinking that we will find all the answers anywhere but in the things that have been spoken to us for millennia.

The best news we have, though, is that Pentecost happened. That years of spiritual failure culminated, not only in God coming to earth in human flesh in order that he might incarnate his good news into the lives of people, but also that once and for all, the power on high came down to imbue us with the necessary faith to survive another day. And all of this did not come from some formula, a special recipe of spirituality with a pinch of Jesus thrown in. It came about because God poured out his Spirit upon all flesh. That God has interceded where all of us had Failed, in order to birth for himself a people that he loves, despite our wayward nature.

So, as I watch my little boy grow up and leave the nest and seek out a new life that he will make for himself, I do worry that I may have done things wrong, and maybe I did. But the one thing I know for sure is that he has never belonged to me. The day he came into the world, the Lord put his mark on him. When he was baptized, my baby died in that font and was raised to new life, in a new family. He is my son, but also my brother because God has made him his own. Because my boy has clung to the Lord for his life, I know he is in good hands. And even though the kid will probably mess up, just as we all have, one thing I know for certain, He is the Lord's. And so are you.


Open Hearth Trip to Hollywood Academy Museum of Motion Dictures
