Dress Code Policy for Female Students

Effective Date January 1, 2027

ENFORCEMENT

Students who are not in compliance with dress code will not be admitted into school. No exceptions. Not the first day of school. Not the last day of school. Parents will be required to take the student home to obtain the correct uniform before the student may attend class. Repeated uniform violations will result in disciplinary action and may jeopardize continued enrollment.

UNIFORMS, GROOMING, ETC.

SHIRT - white, Polo or button down, short or long sleeve

SKORT - dark blue (a skort is a skirt with built-in shorts)

SOCKS & HOSE - dark blue or white (solid color) knee high socks, ankle socks or hose
Senior young women may wear clear hose

SHOES - dark blue or black, no more than 1 inch heel

OUTERWEAR - dark blue sweater or vest or jacket (solid color)

HAIR - Hair must be neat. No hair coloring. Hair must stay out of the eyes and off the eyebrows naturally or with conservative barrettes.

Hair Code for Young Women at Silver Lake Academy

Area	Standard	Accepted Styles	Not Permitted
Overall Appearance	Hair must be neat, clean, and well-groomed at all times	Controlled styles that present a tidy appearance	Unkempt, messy, or poorly maintained hair
Front / Bangs	Must stay out of the eyes	Trimmed or held back with a bobby pin or simple barrette so it does not fall into the eyes	Hair that hangs into or covers the eyes
General Style	Clean, conservative appearance consistent with a Christian school setting	Simple, modest styles such as ponytails, braids, buns, or neatly <u>worn down</u> hair	Extreme, attention-drawing, or poorly maintained styles

The same standards of neatness, cleanliness, and control apply to all young women regardless of hair texture.

The Head of School reserves the right to determine whether a particular style meets these standards.

MAKE-UP - Senior young women may wear eye mascara in a conservative fashion

WATCH - Analog watch is permitted. Digital watch is not allowed.

Why aren't digital watches allowed?

1. Because too many young people do not know how to read a clock face.
2. Many digital watches also have "smart" features that are not permitted in the classroom.

JEWELRY

- No facial or body piercings except young women may wear gold or silver stud earrings (one in each ear)
- One to two simple rings are allowed
- "Girl to Woman" pink wrist bands are allowed

MISC

- No tattoos (If you have one, then you must fully conceal it)
- No painting of the skin or fingernails
