The Dawson County Ag Society consists of four officers and five directors representing all areas of Dawson County. The Ag Society is the governing body for all happenings at the Dawson County Fairgrounds. The buildings and barns at the fairgrounds are rented out throughout the year for various events to assist in paying the expense of repairs and upgrades to the buildings and grounds. They also receive a tax levy from county funds to help support the fairgrounds.
The Ag Society is required by State Law to have a County Fair each year.

## -OPEN CLASS PREMIUM- <br> Premium List Rules: Open Division

1. The Dawson County Agricultural Society, Inc. will not under any circumstances be liable for personal injury or damage of any kind or for damages of any property whatsoever, no matter how caused.
2. Open Class Entries are to be entered from 4:00-8:00 p.m. on Tues., July 11 or from 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 12, 2023. Judging of exhibits begins at 1:00 p.m. All exhibits will be released after 5:00 p.m. on Sunday July 16 or you may pick up on Monday, July 17 from 9:00 a.m. to Noon.
3. Unlawful picketing or demonstrations will be handled as per Nebraska Statute 28-1317, and no leaflets or materials shall be handed out from any location other than commercial display space that has been rented prior to the beginning of the Fair, unless it has been approved prior to the Fair by the Dawson County Ag Society, Inc.
4. Premium money for all classes will be mailed after Fair. All checks will be void if not cashed before 90 days.
5. The Board prefers competent out-of-county judges in all departments. Only if Judges away from this area cannot be found, will local judges be used.
6. The Danish system of judging will be used in all departments. All entries will be grouped as Purple 1st, Blue 2nd or Red 3rd. Premiums will be paid for 1 st, 2nd or 3 rd in all classes. There will be no specifications as to the number or percentage of entries in each group. All could be 1st or all could be 3rd.
7. Any exhibit that has been exhibited and judged at any other 4-H or County Fair cannot be judged and no premiums will be paid.
8. Premiums will be awarded in all divisions.
9. Age groups for Open Class entries include Youth (Y), Adult (A) and Senior (S). Youth group will include high school (spring graduates) age and below, Adult age group includes 18 years to 60 years and Senior age group includes 60 years and up.
10. No exhibitor can be present when the judges are judging if you have an exhibit entered in that department.
11. The premium committee will establish premium amounts, rules and regulations of each department with input from various organizations involved in the fair. They will be approved by the Dawson County Agricultural Society Board of Directors in a regular meeting and will be followed for each ensuing fair unless changes by the Dawson County Agricultural Society Board.

Contestant must have made all crafts and or needlework within the past two years. All entries must be clean and completely dry before entry time. Each Exhibitor is limited to ONE entry under each entry number. Please check premium list and know which lot you wish item entered in. All needlework should be placed in plastic bags for protection.
