Las Posadas (The Inns) is a religious festival celebrated in Mexico, some Latin American countries, and some parts of the United States between December 16 and 24 (symbolizing Mary's 9-month pregnancy). Las Posadas commemorates the journey that Mary and Joseph made from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a safe refuge where Mary could give birth to the baby Jesus. When they were unable to find lodging at an inn in Bethlehem Mary and Joseph had to seek shelter in a stable where

the Christ Child was born.

Experience First Church's second annual Las Posadas on Saturday, December 16, 2023. Please arrive by 3:30 p.m. to check-in at the Welcome Center. The procession, accompanied by a Mariachi Band, will start at 4:30 p.m. We will walk with Mary and Joseph, and angels and shepherds as we journey from First Church to Weber Park, The Gathering Inn, the Main Street Apartments in historical downtown Roseville, and First Church's Centennial Garden. Upon return to the church, we will enjoy a party with the Kindness Tree, tamales, special pinatas, and a visit by Santa Claus, aka Papa Noel! Covid-19 and flu vaccines will be available. Please join us for this special Advent celebration that pays homage to Jesus's birth, but also helps us live into our vision of living into the gospel message of love, hope, joy, and peace to our neighborhood Roseville community.

# "DID YOU KNOW ...."

while our "Keep Us Growing in 2024" pledge campaign did not reach our goals (50 pledges and \$150,000.00 pledged), we did receive more pledges (37) than last year. Our pledged amount (\$119,400.00) exceeded every pledge campaign since 2017, when there were 60 pledges offered. We have a very solid core of faithful givers who continue to give faithfully! Our Charge Conference on November 12, 2023 approved the transfer of \$60,000.00 from our endowment

funds to our general operating budget. This will allow us to pay our 2023 Conference tithes and go into 2024 with a little bit of a cushion. For 2024, we will need to develop additional revenue streams to support our monthly operating expenses. One common source of additional income for many churches is rental income from a full-time tenant, typically a daycare or pre-school. Full-time tenants come with additional responsibilities as well as additional income. If you have expertise in this area we need to hear from you. We are also open to any other ideas! The Finance committee is creating a task force to address fundraising for 2024, including Ruth Ann Baker, Chris Handley, Kristi Kinzel, Kathleen Mirtoni, and Dave Sechrist.
