"The Mission of First United Methodist Church of Roseville is to lovingly invite, nurture, teach and send out disciples of Jesus Christ."

"Then I will speak upon the ashes..."



Those words were spoken by the abolitionist and activist Sojourner Truth in 1863 upon learning of threats to burn down the Indiana building in which she was scheduled to speak. It was her courage and confidence that allowed her to advocate for full equality while anchored in her conviction that, "Truth is powerful, and it always prevails."

The opening quote is relevant for two reasons. First, ash, like dust, is a substance that makes us aware of the shortcomings within our humanity, reinforcing our need to depend on God's grace during the season of Lent. Second, the quote reminds us that March is Women's History Month. Specifically, the theme of this year's celebration elevates the women who struggled for the woman's right to vote in the United States. Honoring the centennial of the passage of the 19th Amendment, this month acknowledges the suffrage movement and those later fights against things like poll taxes, literacy tests, voter roll purges, and other more contemporary forms of voter suppression. During this political season, it is important to recognize the contributions from women like Alice Paul and Mary Church Terrell, and to appreciate that the on-going work of "forming a more perfect union" is never without sacrifice.

This Lenten season, I am not only reflective of God's grace, but reinvigorated to respond to that grace by engaging the issues impacting our communities with the full strength and humility of our faith convictions. Our task, as always, it to exercise the privilege of our individual liberties and social responsibilities in a way that is rooted in the liberating gospel of Jesus to which we have been called.

Indeed, with the God-talk that will inevitably get tossed around by our political leaders, I think it is prudent to remember Susan B. Anthony's words,

Susan B Anthony

"I distrust those people who know so well what God wants them to do because I notice it always coincides with their own desires."

During this month, my prayer is that we may not only recognize the incalculable contribution of women, but that we deepen our sense of connection to God with Lenten intentionality. In so doing, my hope that we can shine in the power of our convictions, even if we must "speak upon the ashes."

ANN WEEMS Review by Nancy Bray



Before 1882 there were no churches in the Roseville area. Most met in the home of a member or a schoolhouse.

When the Rev H. L. Gregory, a Methodist Minister, arrived in 1880. he found five or six members and so he became the first resident minister of Roseville. In 1882 under his leadership, plans were made to build a church.

Mrs. Anna Judah, widow of Theodore Judah, donated a lot on the corner of Washington and Church Streets. Work soon began for Methodist Episcopal Church, Bricks for the church came from J.D. Pratt's brickyard which was on the banks of Dry Creek, near where the old fire station on Oak Street is. Most of the labor was done by the members of the church and others who donated their time.

In March of 1883, the dedication of the \$2500.00 church was held, and the entire town, including the saloon keepers who closed their business for the day, and others, help in the ceremonies. Even Dr. Jewell had the saloon keepers grace the stage and got a bidding war between them going which raised \$900 that day for the church.


