All Saints' Sunday - November 5

HISTORICAL GLEANINGS

The window "Methodist Flame Symbol" was dedicated May 25, 1982 in loving memory of "Andy" S.R. Anderson. Andy was born in North Dakota. Raised by Norwegian parents in a Christian home. Home. He met and married Emma in 1925 and they had three children. They moved to Roseville in 1943 and became members of the Church. A former pastor Robert Benefiel once stated "I would urge you not to forget the pivotal role Andy played as the church was teetering on the brink of disaster." Andy personally donated money to pay for boards, nails, wiring, concrete ingredients and more. He also, personally raised money from friends outside the church and inside as well when discouragement was high and moral was low. He purchased the first new pew for the new sanctuary. He served on many committees within the church and was always ready to lend a hand when and where needed.

Emma was also born in North Dakota, and was by Andy's side in endeavors concerning Andy's physical as well as mental support of the church. In addition to having a job she was always there to do what might be needed including the Women's Circles and cooking for the many functions of the church. Both Lennie and Beverly were also involved in the church for many years.

Emma and daughters Lennie Clark and Beverly Arcuri donated this window in memory of Andy. I can remember when it seemed like maybe Andy lived at the church, he was always there when I was in the building, doing something that needed to be done. **Phoebe Astill, Historian** *Can you find this window?

...we are in a ticklish financial situation? For years our expenses have been sporadically exceeding income, sometimes by a only a little; occasionally we have even shown a gain at the end of a month. However, the trend line has been getting worse in the last two years, and accelerating in the wrong direction most of this year.

We have limited endowment funds on deposit with the California-Nevada United Methodist Foundation that we will need to pull from to get us through 2023 and into 2024. Those funds are targeted to specific ministries and areas of concern as designated by the donors. We are authorized to use 5% of those funds for the targeted ministry areas annually, which we have already done for 2023. Any additional withdrawals in a year must be approved by a Charge Conference of the church. At our Charge Conference on November 12 th, the Finance team will be requesting your approval to withdraw \$50,000.00 from those endowment funds. The withdrawal from the endowment funds will allow us to pay our Conference apportionments, continue to operate with a full-time pastor, and put us on a stable base to begin 2024. Our 2024 budget does incorporate some significant decrease in expenditures, but not enough to cover the gap. We are blessed to have this option available to us as we continue to do the wonderful ministries and works we do in our congregation and in our community. Dave Sechrist, Finance Chair
