

Supervisor Occupational Health & Safety Refresher

- Review of incident causation factors, hazard recognition, assessment, and the selection and implementation of hazard controls;
- Incident investigation requirements using up-to-date MOL Case Studies;
- Performing a health and safety audit on employees and system; and
- Top 20 Steps Toward Supervisor Due Diligence;



Prerequisite: Supervisor Basic Health & Safety Training

- 1) Define and work toward implementing, or improving, the culture of health and safety;
- 2) Understand the value of sending a pro-safety message to new and young workers;
- 3) Exercise their legal duties and responsibilities under the Act, including the duty to accommodate;
- 4) Help implement a workplace violence, harassment and sexual assault policy, and take steps to address these issues, if they arise;
- 5) Conduct a thorough workplace inspection and safety audit; and
- 6) Perform an incident or near miss investigation.
