The ADCA's Buyer's Checklist was created to help guide you towards a successful experience when purchasing your first Dexter Cattle.

These six questions can help you to make a well informed decision.

1. House you soon the enimal?
1. Have you seen the animal?
✓ Familiarize yourself with good breed conformation and acceptable Dexter temperament so you can make an evaluation of these things:
☐ Overall condition
☐ Topline and barrel
☐ Feet and legs
☐ Neck and head
☐ Udder or scrotal package
☐ Temperament and response to human contact
✓ If at all possible, visit the farm where the animal resides. The best way to evaluate any Dexter is to physically see it and
handle it. Ask the owner these types of questions:
☐ Is this animal halter trained or has it had any show experience?
☐ What type of temperament does he/she have?
☐ What is your typical feeding routine/nutritional regimen?
☐ What is your evaluation of this Dexter's
⇒overall condition?
⇒topline and barrel?
⇒feet and legs?
⇒neck and head?
⇒udder or scrotal package?
⇒temperament and response to human contact?
If you are unable to visit the farm prior to your purchase, ask the seller for photos to evaluate the things listed above. A
responsible breeder will not be offended by this request and many Dexters owners may already have pictures of the
animals they are selling. Here are the types of photographs to ask for: ☐ Full body photo of the front, left side, right side, and back of the animal.
\Box A photo of the front, back and side of the udder or scrotal package.
☐ A photo of the none, back and side of the duder of scrotal package.
☐ Photos of offspring produced from this animal's sire and dam.
☐ Photos of the offspring of this animal if they are a mature Dexter.

2. Is the animal ADCA registered?
✓ Ask the seller for the animal's ADCA registration number and a snapshot of the animal's registration certificate.
✓ Look at the animal's pedigree page on the ADCA website :
☐ Go online to http://www.dextercattle.org/ .
☐ At the ADCA website , click the Pedigrees tab located on the menu bar.
\Box Type the animal's registration number in the ADCA Reg. No. box & press the "Enter" key on your keyboard.
\square You will see a "family tree" for this animal, beginning with its sire and dam.
✓ If the animal is NOT registered, ask for it to be registered BEFORE you purchase it. Some Dexters do not qualify for
registration in the ADCA. At the very least, make sure the animal you want to purchase CAN be registered. A full
explanation of registration requirements can be found on the ADCA website. General requirements include:
☐ The animal must be a purebred Dexter from purebred, ADCA registered parents.
☐ Animals registered with the PDCA might qualify for ADCA registration if all ADCA requirements are met.
□ Bulls born after 12-30-2009 and females born after 12-30-2015 must have a genotype on file at an approved lab. The two ADCA approved labs are:
