March letter from the Pastor



Dear Fairview Family,

Grace and peace to you in this holy and reflective season of Lent. As winter slowly loosens its grip and the first hints of spring begin to stir around us, we are reminded that God is always at work bringing life out of what seems dormant, and hope out of what feels weary. Lent invites us into that sacred space of renewal—a time to return, to reflect, and to be reshaped by the mercy of Christ.

We are deeply grateful to have begun this season with a powerful and Spirit-filled Ash Wednesday service shared in partnership with our friends from **Fort McKinley, Grace, and McKinley United Methodist Churches**. It was a beautiful witness to our unity in Christ and a meaningful way to enter into Lent together. I am thankful for all who attended from our various congregations and for those who participated in making the evening so moving. In particular, I want to express sincere appreciation to our Director of Music, Michelle Forshaw, our Accompanist, Nancy Collins, and our Chancel Choir for leading us so faithfully in worship. Their gifts enriched the service in a profound way.

Building on that spirit of partnership, we are already in conversation with Grace UMC about sharing Holy Week services this year—planning for Maundy Thursday to be held here at Fairview and Good Friday at Grace. We are excited about the possibilities and the witness such collaboration offers to our community. Please stay tuned for more details in the coming weeks.

As we continue through Lent, we will be journeying together through our lectionary-based sermon series, ***From Dust to Breath: What God Does with Broken People***. This series explores one of the central truths of our faith: that God does not discard what is broken—God redeems it. Week by week, we will trace the biblical story of how the Lord meets people in their frailty, their failure, their wilderness moments, and breathes new life into them. From dust to divine breath, from repentance to restoration, from wilderness testing to resurrection hope—this series will challenge and encourage us to see how God is still at work in our own unfinished stories.

If you want to go deeper, I strongly encourage you to join us for **Renewal Hour Bible Study on Wednesdays at 3:30 p.m.** Each week will serve as an extension of the Sunday message, allowing us to explore the texts and themes in greater depth and conversation. There is something powerful about opening Scripture together and asking, “What is God saying to us now?” You may join us in person or online via Zoom. If Lent is stirring something in you—if you desire more than just Sunday morning—Renewal Hour is the place to grow.

Of course, Lent is not only about hearing the Word; it is about practicing it. This season calls us to be intentional about the spiritual disciplines that shape us—fasting, generosity, repentance, and especially prayer. Prayer is not an accessory to the Christian life; it is its lifeblood. At Fairview, we have always sought to be a praying church, and in the months ahead we hope to revitalize and strengthen our Prayer Ministry Team.


We are prayerfully seeking additional volunteers who feel called to participate in and help lead this vital ministry. Let me be clear: this does not require an overwhelming time commitment. What we are primarily looking for are faithful, compassionate individuals who would be willing to pray with others on Sunday mornings following worship. Sometimes the most powerful ministry that happens all week takes place in those quiet, sacred moments when one believer places a hand on another’s shoulder and says, “Let us pray.”

Scripture calls us to “bear one another’s burdens,” and one of the most direct ways we do that is through intercessory prayer. When we pray for one another, we create space for healing, encouragement, repentance, and hope. We cultivate a culture where no one has to carry their burdens alone. If you sense even the slightest nudge from the Holy Spirit toward this ministry, I encourage you to respond. Please contact me, Pam Hounshell, or Ed Rapp if you are interested in being part of this important work.

As we walk this Lenten road together—from dust toward breath—may we do so with open hearts, renewed commitment, and deep trust in the God who is not finished with us yet.

For several years, the Fairview United Women in Faith has urged Fairview members and friends to give a special offering of \$5 or more on the 5th Sunday of each month. The special offering was sent to United Methodist Children's Home Family Services (UMCH) in Columbus, OH where services are given to foster parents or those who want to become foster parents, for adoption services and individual and family counseling or other services that benefit families.

As of November 5, 2025 a new agency was formed with the combining of United Methodist Children's Home Family Services (UMCH) in Columbus and CHOICES, Inc.. in Dayton became a new alliance that is called United Methodist Children and Families (UMCF). With this alliance, foster care/services, mental health services, home -based and in-home services along with independent living & youth transition services and adoptions will continue to be strengthened across central and southwest Ohio.

The new Chief Executive Officer is Alisha Murray who was CEO of Daybreak in Dayton just prior to being named in this new position. She is hopeful that they can ensure that every child and family has access to the hope, healing and opportunity they deserve.

\$5 on the 5th is one way that churches can continue to help provide love, safety and healing for Ohio's children. On the months with a fifth Sunday, Fairview members and friends are invited to give \$5 or more to support Ohio's children and families. These small gifts add up, helping provide loving foster homes, outpatient mental health counseling and adoptive families for children in need.

BOOK REVIEWED: GRACE CAN LEAD US HOME A Christian Call to End Homelessness

On any given night, over a half million Americans and Canadians find themselves sleeping on the streets, in shelters, cars, and other places not meant for human habitation. And the crisis continues to grow. The subject of homelessness remains one of the least talked about complexities in our communities and in our churches.

Kevin Nye helped me to begin to understand that persons who experience homelessness are not only about the exclusion of persons, but about the lack of access to resources and a constant fight for persons to belong. It is about changing the environment of criminalization, mistreatment as the lens through which we see this population who is constantly seen but not SEEN and certainly not seen as persons who deserve to have what everyone has: a decent place to lay their heads and to be able to live without fear of being herded to sections of our cities that are unfit for human to live.

Every time we pass someone carrying a sign that says: “I am homeless and need help”, are our hearts strangely warmed or do we drive away as quickly as we can as if they are invisible? Kevin says that his fervent prayer is that Christians can be champions who say that homelessness is out of sync with God’s ideals for all of God’s children. When Christians can begin to see God in each person who is experiencing homelessness and can talk to persons whom we see and learn about the situations that brought them to being homeless, we will make necessary changes in ourselves and believe that **Grace will Lead us ALL home!**

WHEN DO WE SPRING FORWARD? GET READY FOR DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME.

Daylight saving time in the U.S. starts on the second Sunday in March and ends on the first Sunday in November. This is the schedule the nation has followed since 2007, according to Time and Date.

In 2026, [daylight saving time](#) will begin at 2 a.m. on **March 8**, according to Time and Date. U.S. residents should set their clocks forward one hour, to 3 a.m.

That day, sunrise and sunset will be about one hour later than the previous day, and there will be more light in the evening and less light in the morning. Daylight saving time ends on Sunday, Nov. 1.
