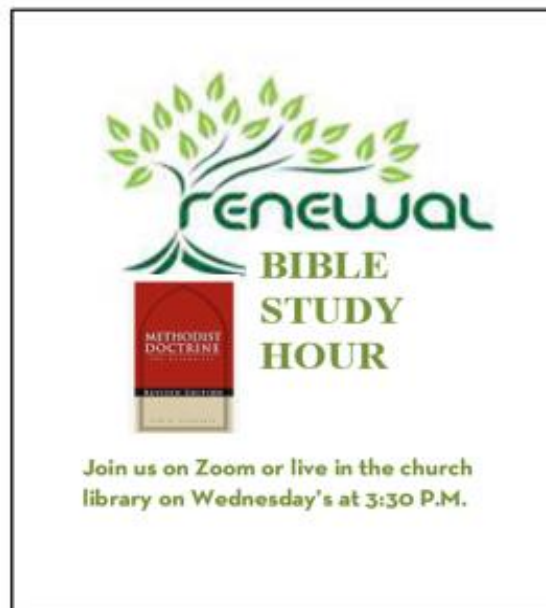

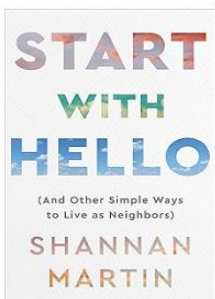

NOVEMBER 2025 PANTRY NEWS

Feeding Our Neighbors in Challenging Times

Our church food pantry continues to be a vital source of help and hope in our community. Each week, we see more individuals and families turning to us for assistance—many for the very first time.

Recently, the ongoing **government shutdown** has made life even harder for those already struggling. Many households will lose or see delays in their **SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)** benefits, leaving them without the resources they depend on to put food on the table. This has placed additional pressure on food pantries across the region, including ours.

Thanks to your continued generosity—through food donations, financial gifts, and volunteer service—we are able to meet this growing need. Every contribution helps ensure that no one who comes to our doors is turned away hungry.

As we approach **Thanksgiving**, we are collecting **holiday staple items** to share with families in need.

The list of items for the Month of November are:

Canned pumpkin, canned sweet potatoes, brown sugar, cranberry sauce, boxed stuffing mix, Jiffy cornbread mix, french fried onions, chicken or turkey gravy mix, marshmallows, and vegetable oil or other items that you would serve at your Thanksgiving meal.

You might consider bringing the items as follows:

November 2 – Loaves of bread (Sandwich bread is popular)

November 9 – Canned pumpkin, canned sweet potatoes, brown sugar, Jellied cranberry sauce

November 16 – Boxed stuffing mix, Jiffy cornbread mix, french fried onions, marshmallows

November 23 – Chicken or Turkey gravy, canned milk, Vegetable oil.

Together, we can make sure every family in our community has something to be thankful for this season.

Thank you for being the hands and heart of Christ to our neighbors in need.

FOODBANK UPDATE

We recently passed our annual inspection with a representative from The Foodbank. During the visit, we discussed the many large-scale food distributions that have been featured in the news. The distributions sponsored by CareSource are fully funded by CareSource, while The Foodbank provides the resources and tracking support. In addition, The Foodbank is required to conduct three mass distributions each year—one in each of Preble, Montgomery, and Greene Counties.

Our representative also reminded us that The Foodbank does not purchase food directly. All the food we receive comes to them through distribution networks such as Feeding America. Unfortunately, some of those federal channels have recently been eliminated.

The Foodbank currently supports 112 pantries across the region and is not accepting new sites at this time. We are proud to be one of the larger partners, serving three times a week, including one evening distribution. The Foodbank staff expressed deep appreciation for the work we do to serve our neighbors with dignity and compassion.

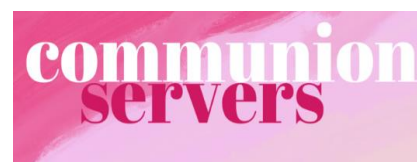

Choices' Voices

Choices receives largest grant in our history



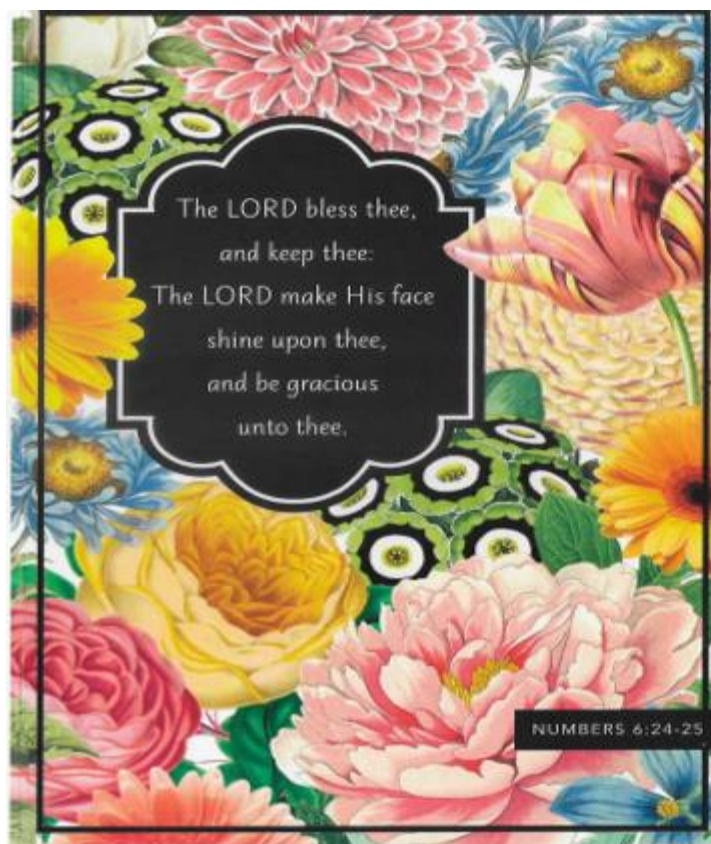

In addition to services he receives, Maurice is an honored member of our staff, serving as a part-time janitor at our Needmore Road office. "We are very pleased to share that Choices has received our largest grant since we began services in 1985." Choices' Chief Executive Officer Trent Grooms made the announcement that the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has confirmed a grant in the amount of \$545,000 for the purchase of five vans, with those vans to be purchased and added to our vehicle fleet in 2026. According to Trent, this follows the purchase of two new vans in 2025 that were made possible through a \$115,000 grant from ODOT.

Choices operates one of the largest vehicle fleets in the Miami Valley, with a total of 52 vans with the addition of the two new vans in 2025, providing Non-Medical Transportation Services for those served directly by Choices, as well as community participants in our Adult Day Services programs, including Fun-Fit and Choices Champions. This door-to-door accessible transportation is also available for individuals to and from jobs in the community. Each home owned and/or operated by Choices also has a designated van to assure access and integration in the community, as required by rules and regulations of the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, as well as by Choices' mission-focused commitment to inclusion and independence.

"We are grateful for the support of ODOT for playing such a critical role in support of those we serve," continues Trent. "We are equally grateful for the work of Amy Fansher in preparing and submitting our application that made these grants possible. While she fulfills her primary responsibilities as Program Director for our Adult Day Services and Non-Medical Transportation program at an exceptional level on a daily basis, it is her skills in understanding and preparing grants of this magnitude that will have life changing impact on the lives of those we serve for years to come. A truly remarkable accomplishment!"
