A Letter from the Pastor



Resurrection Greetings to everyone here at Fairview United Methodist Church as well as our community beyond!

What an exciting time of year it is, especially for those of us who have put our trust and faith in Jesus Christ as our Savior! A portion of scripture in the Bible shows the tremendous victory Christ won over death as He arose from the grave in power and authority..

1 Corinthians 15:55–57 (NRSVUE) — "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" ⁵⁶ The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. ⁵⁷ But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

As I read this passage, it almost seems that the Apostle Paul is taunting death because He knows the resurrection of Christ was then and *continues to be* the ultimate testimony to the truthfulness of the claims of Christ.

In a world of decaying values and shifting "truths," we as believers know there is One who has never changed and never will change!

From the moment Jesus breathed his final breath on Friday, it seemed death would win, and life would lose. But when Jesus emerged from the tomb on that first Easter Sunday, death itself was defeated and ultimately emptied of its power. Thus, it is in this Easter season that we celebrate this victory of Christ, and we reaffirm our blessed hope that death is not the end of our stories.

Friends, we have a reason to celebrate and worship! In a world that seems overwhelmed with strife and despair, we as Christians should be shining our light MORE and not less! And our light *is* shining brightly here at Fairview, and I will highlight just a few things.

First, our United Methodist Men's Ministry successfully launched last month. We were blessed to have eleven men in attendance for that first breakfast meeting. There was some wonderful devotions, conversation, and prayer and I'm especially grateful for Ed Rapp's leadership of this new ministry. Our next steps will be officially chartering, and our next meeting will take place on Saturday April 20th at 8:30 AM at the Bob Evans on Miller Lane. If you weren't able to join us for our first outing, we hope you'll consider joining us this month for a time of fellowship and spiritual formation for men!

Next, as cold and flu season begins to wane in the Miami Valley, we will return to Holy Communion via intinction on Sunday April 7th as I know many of us have been missing this. In this series we will be looking at Acts as our model for living in to the reality of the resurrection and claiming the gifts of the Spirit for our ministry as Christ's disciples to the world.

Death has been defeated, the darkness of the tomb is on retreat, and the light of resurrection life is shining ever brightly here at Fairview. Join us and be a part of it!



NOTES FROM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT INSPECTOR



Kitchen sinks have specific purposes. The sink to the left of the refrigerator is for hand washing only. No other liquids should be poured into it. Coffee and other drinks should be poured into the bar sink in the parish hall. The three-compartment sink is for dishwashing, rinsing, and sanitizing only. Pre-rinsing dishes or containers should be done over the garbage disposer. Signs will be posted as a reminder. As a licensed commercial kitchen now, we are all responsible for the proper use of the kitchen area.

JOIN US Prayer

As a TEAM, we are getting creative when we pray at our monthly Prayer Team Meetings. Everyone is invited to join us! Our next meeting will be on **Wednesday**, **April 10th at 2:15 PM in the church library**. We're trying out different methods to pray. So far, there have been two unique prayer times.

<In February> We used Lego-like building blocks as we prayed for ourselves, our group, and our church. It was a meditative prayer time. At the end we had built a strong tower/building that represents how we work together. It helps to have a visual depiction of what God says and who we are in Christ.

<In March> We each wrote out brief prayer requests in seven different areas and prayed together. We used "Popcorn Prayer" which is where we take short turns to talk to God about those requests (like how kernels of corn pop quickly to make popcorn). Then we each took some of the papers with us and continued praying at home afterwards.

We will do something else in April... you are invited to join us... it is a wonderful way to reinvigorate your prayer time with God! There is a power in coming together for a time of prayer.
