CHRISMON TREE IN THE FAIRVIEW UNITED METHODIST CHURCH SANCTUARY

Each year beginning with the First Sunday of Advent, the Chrismon tree is placed at the front of the Fairview United Methodist Church Sanctuary. The Chrismon tree was first used by North American Lutherans in 1957. Catholics, Anglicans, United Methodists, and Reformed are some churches that use the Chrismon tree as a symbol of the true meaning of Christmas.

The word Chrismon is a contraction of the two words – Christ and Monogram. It is traditionally a Christmas tree that is decorated with symbols from Christian

history that tell the story of the true spiritual meaning of Christmas. Christian monograms or Chrismons have been used throughout the ages as signs of Christian faith. The evergreen tree is decorated with clear lights and symbolizes the eternal life Jesus Christ provides. Chrismons are made of white and gold material which were the liturgical colors of the Christmas season. The Chrismons that decorate the Fairview tree were made by the Fairview women as they worked many hours to create the beautiful symbols of Christ.
